





Parish Bulletin –Term 2, Week 5

This week, we celebrated Reconciliation Week 2025 with a special school preview of Illume, a new production by Bangarra Dance Theatre Company at the Roslyn Packer Theatre. This production showcased music, visuals, and dance to explore the way light has captivated and sustained indigenous culture, drawing on 65,000 years of heritage. Some of our students also represented Mater Maria at the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Service Person's Commemoration at the ANZAC Memorial in Hyde Park on Friday. Additionally, Mater Maria is featured in Reconciliation Australia's special choir project. Our students joined voices with choirs from across the country to sing "Solid Rock" by Shane Howard, celebrating unity and reconciliation. We are proud to be part of this powerful movement, reminding us that all over this country, we are living on the sacred Land of the First Nations people. Congratulations to all musicians and singers.

Our Year 9 students embarked on a two-day hike and overnight camp in Kuringai National Park as their Practice Adventurous Journey for the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award. They improved their navigational skills while carrying all their food, clothing, tents, and sleeping bags in their backpacks. The hike fostered teamwork and culminated in two wonderful days of hiking and camping in beautiful surroundings.

Thirty Year 10 students attended the CSBB 'Shine' Student Leaders event at St Peter's College in Tuggerah. This gathering provided aspiring leaders from various schools across the Diocese with an opportunity for leadership and faith formation.

Each year, we hold a House Liturgy and lunch for each of our five houses. Pius House celebrated their student led liturgy this week and enjoyed muffins at recess as well.

Many Year 11 students spent the week doing work placéments at various organisations and businesses.

It has also been a busy week for sports at Mater Maria, from daily basketball sessions to participation in various competitions. Our students have showcased their skills and sportsmanship in the MWBA Basketball Competition, BNSW Opens State Finals at Penrith Valley Regional Sports Complex, Peninsula Cup competitions for netball, U14s and U16s soccer, the Bill Turner Cup soccer competition for U15s, and the Broken Bay Cross Country Championships at the Gosford Racecourse.

Every Friday, our prefects lead Faith Fridays, inviting all students to join in for faith and music in the Chapel and Courtyard, fostering a sense of community.

The Living Word

Entrance Antiphon Acts of the Apostles 1:11

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11 A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.' As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there'

May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

REFLECTION

The Feast of the Ascension is really a kind of liminal moment in the Easter season. It is a time between times; a moment when we have left one place but have not yet arrived at a second. While the narratives that describe the Ascension fit well into the unfolding story of redemption, the feast celebrates the exaltation of Jesus. The readings allow us to focus on this theological point while we commemorate a turning point in the life of the church. We do this by considering the enthronement of Christ in the heavens and the new body of Christ on earth.

Many of the Easter accounts have directed our attention to the appearances of Jesus which were intended to strengthen the Christians' belief in his bodily resurrection.

Today we stand awestruck, watching Jesus ascend into the clouds of heaven, there to be enthroned at the right hand of God. Today is a day to be overwhelmed by the reality of the divinity of the one whom we have known in his humanity. Christ who ascended into heaven in his body carries on what he began on earth through his new body, the community of believers. He teaches through its apostles and evangelists. He ministers through its prophets and pastors. We have not been left alone; we have his power, the same power with which he performed marvels when he walked the earth. We have not been left alone; we have each other. Together we make up the new body of
