


I am currently in the process of finalising committee roles and will be in contact shortly with those who have been recommended with details about an upcoming meeting.

Parish Bulletin - Term 2, Week 7

This week was shorter due to the King's Birthday on Monday, giving students and staff a long weekend to relax.

As the HSC draws closer, Mater Maria students joined St Paul's Catholic College students studying Year 12 Music for an HSC Performance Workshop. They performed one of their HSC pieces for each other and workshopped it in our Byrne Theatre.

Our Mater Musicians also performed at this week's College Assembly. The Year 12 music and vocal ensemble performed "Solid Rock," while the Year 11 musicians performed the Aboriginal "Our Father" as part of Reconciliation Week activities.

Year 12 Society & Culture students attended the Wesley Conference Centre in Sydney for HSC Study Day. Experienced HSC teachers presented sessions using study hints and tips, unpacked past HSC questions, and addressed a range of syllabus dot points and contemporary examples.

Our annual Year 7 Spirituality Day took place on Friday in the Marana Complex, Byrne Theatre, College Chapel and classrooms.

Close to 80 Mater Maria students from every year group joined a Zonta Club meeting this week. Students worked together during lunchtime to construct Care Cushions for patients in local hospitals recovering from surgery.

Meanwhile, Year 10 students attended the annual Stand Tall Event. Motivational speakers at the International Convention Centre (ICC) equipped our students with essential life skills, including resilience, standing up against bullying, motivation, perspective and decision-making.

Our students thrived in a busy week of sports competitions, including the NSWCCC Cross Country Championships, MWBA basketball, Peninsula Cup soccer and netball, umpiring and coaching programs, the Broken Bay Junior Soccer Gala Day, and the Bill Turner Cup. Over 20 students attended the 2025 High School Wavepool Teams Challenge at Homebush this week. It was the second event of the 2025 High School Surf Series.

Every Friday, our prefects lead Faith Fridays, a special time of reflection, music, and community in the Chapel and Courtyard. All students are warmly invited to join.

IMPORTANT FACTS TO KNOW AND SHARE ABOUT THE HOLY TRINITY

Where does the word "Trinity" come from?

It comes from the Latin word trinitas, which means "three" or "triad." The Greek equivalent is triados.

When was it first used?

The first surviving use of the term (there may have been earlier uses that are now lost) was around A.D. 170 by Theophilus of Antioch, who wrote: In like manner also the three days which were before the luminaries, are types of the Trinity [$T\rho\iota\dot{\alpha}\delta\sigma\varsigma$], of God, and His Word, and His wisdom. And the fourth is the type of man, who needs light, that so there may be God, the Word, wisdom, man.

What is the Trinity?

The Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains it this way:

The Church expresses her trinitarian faith by professing a belief in the oneness of God in whom there are three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The three divine Persons are only one God because each of them equally possesses the fullness of the one and indivisible divine nature.

Is the Trinity the central mystery of the Christian Faith?

Yes. The Compendium explains: The central mystery of Christian faith and life is the mystery of the Most Blessed Trinity.

How can the Trinity be proved?

The Trinity can only be proved through the divine revelation that Jesus brought us. It cannot be proved by natural reason or from the Old Testament alone. The Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church states:

God has left some traces of his trinitarian being in creation and in the Old Testament but his inmost being as the Holy Trinity is a mystery which is inaccessible to reason alone or even to Israel's faith before the Incarnation of the Son of God and the sending of the Holy Spirit.

How can we show from Scripture that there is only one God?

The fact that there is only one God was already made clear in the Old Testament. For example, the book of Isaiah proclaims:

"You are my witnesses," says the Lord, "and my servant whom I have chosen, that you may know and believe me and understand that I am He. Before me no god was formed, nor shall there be any after me [Isaiah 43:10].

Thus says the Lord, the King of Israel and his Redeemer, the Lord of hosts: "I am the first and I am the last; besides me there is no god" [Isaiah 44:6].

How can we show that the Son is generated by the Father and that the Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son?

The fact that the Son is generated by the Father is indicated by the names of these Persons. Sons are generated by fathers. The Second Person of the Trinity would not be a Son if he were not generated by the First Person as his Father.

The fact that the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son is reflected in another statement of Jesus:

But when the Counselor comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, even the Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father, he will bear witness to me [John 15:26].

This depicts the Holy Spirit proceeding from the Father and the Son ("whom I shall send"). Here the outward operations of the Persons of the Trinity reflect their mutual relations with each other. It may also be said that the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father through the Son.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, by faith we are judged righteous and at peace with God, since it is by faith and through Jesus that we have entered this state of grace in which we can boast about

looking forward to God's glory. But that is not all we can boast about; we can boast about our sufferings. These sufferings bring patience, as we know, and patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us.


REFLECTION

Both the first reading and the psalm response celebrate the marvels of creation and the marvelous creator who brought them into being. Proverbs states that God created all of these things through Wisdom. While later theology will identify Wisdom with both the Word of God, the second person of the Trinity, and the Holy Spirit, the third person, the reading itself does not suggest this. Paul credits God with our justification through faith. Justification or salvation is accomplished by God through our Lord Jesus Christ. The love of God is poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. Paul does not clearly state that the love of God that we receive through the Holy Spirit sanctifies us, but one could certainly understand it in this way. John's theology resembles very closely

that of Paul. In it, Jesus reveals the intimate connection between himself and the Father as well as himself and the Spirit. The Spirit continues the mission of Jesus, neither adding anything to his teaching nor omitting anything from it. While this is a feast that glorifies the central mystery of our faith, a mystery that is based on the way the three divine persons relate to each other, the readings all address ways that God relates to us. If we concentrate, as the texts for today suggest that we do, on all of the ways that our Triune God has blessed us, we may be more inclined to cry out with the psalmist: 'O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!'




