



## Parish Bulletin – Term 2, Week 4

This week, our Year 12 students enjoyed a wonderful time at the Mater Maria Senior Retreat held at the picturesque Benedict XVI Retreat Centre in Grose Vale, NSW. Our Year 12s eagerly explored a variety of topics and experiences, engaging in different forms of prayer, discussing the relationship between science and faith, and tackling ethical questions relevant to young people today. This retreat provided a special opportunity for students to deepen their relationships with peers, staff and God. Highlights included participating in Reconciliation and Mass, among other meaningful activities throughout the program.

This term, over twenty students from Years 9 and 10 are actively engaged in the Alpha for Youth Catholic Faith Formation Program. Designed to foster spiritual growth and deepen understanding of the Catholic faith, this comprehensive curriculum empowers students to emerge as compassionate leaders within their communities.

Year 9 Textiles Technology students conducted consumer research into the marketing of certain products at Warriewood Square.

This week, students in Years 10 and 11 visited Ausgrid's depot in Cromer to learn more about careers in the electrical field, thanks to the partnership between the RIEP Program and Ausgrid. Last year, eight students secured Ausgrid apprenticeships through their Bright Spark Program.

Nature enthusiasts in Year 11 explored the Gibberagong Environmental Education Centre at Bobbin Head, investigating fox mitigation programs aimed at safeguarding the Southern Brown Bandicoots. This environmental adventure aligned perfectly with their Year 11 Biology field trip, fostering a sense of responsibility towards our planet.

It has been yet another bustling week of sporting ctivities at Mater Maria. With daily basketball and enthusiastic involvement in a range of competitions, our students have been showcasing their talents and spirit of sportsmanship. Our sporting endeavours this week have included the MWBA basketball competition, Peninsula Cup netball, Peninsula Cup soccer, CSBB Cross Country Championships and the Jamie Lyons and Steve Menzies City Cup for U13 and U15 students.

For prospective students, applications for Year 7 are now open for 2027 and 2028. A waitlist is in place for students transitioning from Year 6 to Year 7 in 2025, and Year 6 to Year 7 in 2026, as well as for all other year groups in 2024. ## Things to Know and Share about the Holy Trinity



## Where does the word "Trinity" come from?

It comes from the Latin word trinitas, which means "three" or "triad."

#### When was it first used?

The first surviving use of the term (there may have been earlier uses that are now lost) was around A.D. 170 by Theophilus of Antioch.

#### What is the Trinity?

The Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains it this way:
The Church expresses her trinitarian faith by professing a belief in the oneness of God in whom there are three Persons:
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
The three divine Persons are only one God because each of them equally possesses the fullness of the one and indivisible

## How can we show that the Father, the Son, and the Spirit are distinct Persons?

The distinction of the persons can be shown, for example, in the fact that Jesus speaks to his Father. This would make no sense if they were one and the same person. At that time Jesus declared, 'I thank thee, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that thou hast hidden these things from the wise and understanding and revealed them to babes; yea, Father, for such was thy gracious will. The fact that Jesus is not the same Person as the Holy Spirit is revealed when Jesus, who has been functioning as the Counselor (Greek, Parakletos) of the disciples--says he will pray to the Father and the Father will given then "another Counselor," who is the Holy Spirit. This shows the distinction of all three Persons: Jesus who prays; the Father who sends; and the Spirit who comes.

### REFLECTION

The feast of the Holy Trinity brings us face to face with the foundation of our faith. The readings for today provide answers to the question: Who is God? They can really only suggest something about the mystery of God, and they can do this only indirectly. They call to mind some of the wonders that God has accomplished for us and in us. It is through reflection on these gracious divine acts that we can get glimpses of God.


The psalm declares that the harmony and interdependence that we see in creation point to a majestic creator responsible for it all. The account of the history of

God's people reveals a God who desires to establish an intimate relationship with them, enters their history as protector and guide, and forgives disloyalty. Finally, Jesus teaches that God sent him into the world to save it, has made us adopted children through the Holy Spirit, and will ultimately clothe us in divine glory. It is from his teaching that we hear that the Son was sent by the Father, the Spirit, which was also his Spirit, proceeded from the Father and from him. From our own experience, we know that God creates, because we are immersed in creation. We know that God saves, because we have been freed from the bondage of our own demons. Our experience tells us that God is with us, and that God is for us. Everything that we know about God declares that God is passionately in love with us, boundlessly so!


