3.18.5 SIGNS OF COVENANT

Unit Focus: Students are encouraged to reflect upon the nature of thier own vocation and how Catholics are nourished and sustained as they reach out to serve others.

Lesson Focus/Aim: To develop in the students a clear understanding of the word 'Covenant'.

Students are challenged to:

- To form a covenant agreement within their own family.
- To respect and follow those who seek to serve God through their sacramental relationship with God.


In class: Students have discussed God's promise to Noah to help explore the terms: agreement, contract and covenant.

Family supplement activity: Families plan their own sealed agreement.

SIGNS OF COVENANT 3.18.5

- Plan a family meeting, meal, or get together.
- Talk together about what your family motto, credo, saying or message is.
- Together try to design a FAMILY stamp/seal that is meaningful and unique to your family.
- Make your own family seal to stamp on a family agreement/covenant. (Definitely a parent needed if heating wax) Mould/stamp can be made from apple, potato, cork, thin sponge.

Use wax, play dough, plasticine, even thick paint or the like.



Use a family centred statement that typifies your own family motto or credo, a statement of principles or beliefs, especially one that is professed formally. For example: All for one, one for all! Family first! The family that prays together stays together!

Or

Use your initials, names etc to create a family crest which can be used as the family seal!
