Zach 9: 9-10; Rom 8: 9, 11-13; Mt 11: 25-30

Two striking words come out of the readings are "humble" and "rest." Although they are not usually linked, they, in GOD's eyes, are actually linked and both have a meaning slightly different from the normal understanding of the two words. Zechariah announces that the Messiah (the saviour and king) will come not as a mighty military dictator but as the humble proclaimer of peace. The psalm speaks of GOD as the ruler who is gracious and merciful. St. Paul contrasts earthly life with that of life in the Spirit which brings true life. In the Gospel, Jesus promises rest and freedom from labours and from burdens to those who learn from Jesus for He is meek and humble of heart.

The Gospel passage today begins with Jesus proclaiming a hymn of praise to His Abba-Father and describing the close relationship that

exists between Himself and His *Abba*. Jesus continues by extending a share in this special bond to all who come to Him. Jesus realizes that many of His disciples (both during His earthly life and today) are weary and burdened. Jesus knows, both from His divine knowledge and human experience, that earthly life can be quite tiresome and challenging. He wants His followers to come to Him and be yoked with Him so that they can learn from Him and have Him take all the effects of the burden.

The concept of being yoked with Jesus speaks of a close relationship, since a yoke joined two beasts of burden together so that they could work together to get a difficult job accomplished. Jesus invites us to be joined with Him so that He can do the majority of the work and take some of the pressure off us. He promises to teach us a way which bring us a reduction of the stress with which life encumbers us.

The challenge for us, however, is that we have to give up our independent and selfish ways and be joined completely with Jesus. We have to humble ourselves and admit that we cannot do it by ourselves. We need to give up control and allow Jesus to help shoulder the burden, in fact, to take most of the burden. In doing so we will find rest and refreshment because Jesus will be doing the greater part of the work.

It is so hard for some of us to give up control – even to Jesus. We think we have to do it all by ourselves. We want to follow the attitude of the song "I Did It My Way." Yet it is when we try to be the master of our own destiny that we are people of the flesh. It is then that we struggle so hard, trying to do a task we were never meant to do alone. We need to let go of the control of our lives and let the Lord Jesus take over. That takes humility. It means we have to humbly admit we are not the be-all and end-all of the world, not even the be-all and end-all of our own lives. It is when we can humbly surrender to GOD that we will experience the rest and freedom from the heavy burden which we carry. Are you ready to surrender to Jesus to take control of you?
