



WOY WOY PENINSULA PARISH St John the Baptist Catholic Church

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time 18th October 2020. Year A (Psalter Week 1)



During this previous week, MSFS confreres, Provinces and the Congregations celebrated the Birth Centenary of our wonderful gift from God, Fr. Francis Moget. He was the last MSFS French-Indian missionary who spent 58 years in India. We take this occasion to remember him and express our deepest appreciation for his dedication to our Missionary and our people. We praise and thank him for all the good he was enabled to do through his prayerful life, spirit filled priestly ministry and religious life. His life and teaching, was an inspiration to many of us.

Fr. Francis Moget was born in France on 14th Oct 1920 and from an early age he knew the Lord was calling him to the Priesthood. As the eldest son, his father would not give permission for him to start his journey. However, when he was nearly 12 years of age, his Father died. After that, his Parish Priest asked his mother if she would allow her son to become a priest. She RIP 14/10/1920 - 17/9/2005 remarked that he would be helpful to her carrying on the farm work; but said if God wanted him then she would let him go. Francis did not want to be not a diocesan priest but a missionary priest so his Parish Priest contacted the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales. Thus, the Lord brought the 12 year old Francis Moget to the MSFS Junior Seminary at the Ville-La-Grand College on the Franco-Swiss border. At the age of 18 Francis did his Novitiate at Rue near Fribourg and made his First Profession on 24th August 1939.

In September 1939 as WW2 had broken out, he could not leave France, so arrangements were made for him and two other MSFS Seminarians to study Philosophy then Theology at the Annecy Major Seminary. He made his Final Profession on 16th April 1943 and was under orders to go to Germany to work in the Nazi factories but he was determined to complete his 4th year of Theology and be ordained Priest, so he decided to become a Vagabond for God, escaping to neutral Switzerland. As the boundary wall of the MSFS College is sat exactly on the border of France and Switzerland, on 6th July 1943, Br. Francis went over this high boundary wall. Full of joy at being safe in Switzerland, he sat on a stone and prayed a decade of the Rosary. He was taken to Geneva and from there went to the MSFS Scholasticate at Fribourg. He completed his Theology studies at the University of Fribourg and was ordained a priest at the Church of St. Michael, Fribourg, on 30th July 1944. He continued a further 2 years of ministry in France until 1946.

1947 - Fr Moget arrived in Bombay teaching in the St. Charles Seminary and taking care of the Jaitala mission. 1953 - he was in Palaghat mission to learn Hindi, and later went to Europe as a delegate for the General Chapter. 1954 - 1963: Nine Years as Rector at Fransalian Seminary. Pune 1963 - 1969: Six Years as Director at Apostolic School cum Boarding, Aldona, Goa 1969 - 1981: Twelve Years as Rector in the Minor Seminary, Bastora, Goa 1982 - 1987: Five Years as the Novice Master at the Novitiate at Fransalian Ashram, Belgaum, Karnataka 1988 - 2005: Writing Books, Articles, Preaching Retreats and assisting as a Formator in the Novitiate Community. Fr. Moget made himself a writer of the history of our Congregation in India and wrote 2 books about the growth of the Catholic Church in Central India. "Vagabonds for God" and" Shepherds for Christ".

Fr. Moget was well-known for giving monetary assistance to the needy so that they could get food or medical treatment or educational aid or even to build a house. His vision was not limited to the formation of the Seminarians but to provide housing for poor Catholics. A true visionary he could see things beyond the generations to come. Fr. Moget bought up large amounts of land next to the Fransalian Seminary, Pune some of this land was used for vegetable gardens and farming, to provide for the local communities as well as schools and playgrounds. All these generous acts were from his own financial resources and contacts made by him with the benefactors and donors abroad.

Fr. Moget was always in demand to preach at retreats to priests and sisters, and as a spiritual director and confessor to religious. He kept up a regular correspondence with many members of our Congregation as well as numerous friends and benefactors/donors in different parts of the world. He was a brilliant conversationalist able to entertain anyone, from Novices, guests, non-Christian and visitors. He was a wealth of knowledge regarding the MSFS Congregation.

Despite a few hardships to his health, our dear Fr. Francis Moget carried on, as ever cheerful and always a sterling Fransalian Missionary until he reached his eternal home on 17th September 2005 at Fransalian Ashram, Uchgaon, Belagavi, Karnataka, India. His love for India was outstanding. Whatever he did he did it all for the greater glory of God and the glory of India and the Indian People.


Gospel

Covid19 Updates:

It is extremely important that every Parishioner is aware of the health advice during this Pandemic. If the Church is found to be in breach of these guidelines we will find ourselves with a hefty fine so PLEASE read the signs and the notices and familiarise yourself with the information provided.— IF YOU FEEL UNWELL PLEASE STAY HOME

The number of people per Masses has been capped again. The maximum number allowed is 100 people. When you arrive for Mass there will be someone at the sign-in table conducting a headcount. Once 100 people are signed in, any remaining people will be invited to attend the Walter Baker Hall where a simultaneous Mass will be held. It is imperative that EVERY PERSON who enters the church or Hall for Mass puts their name and contact details on the list in the Gathering Space. This includes Musicians, Servers and Readers. This information will be handed over the Health Department should an outbreak occur.

Attention Readers, Servers & Musicians (organists and cantors) Please note that readers, servers & musicians are included in 100 person headcount. Fr Timothy has asked those rostered to arrive a little earlier than normal to sign in. *Can readers sit in the small section at the front of the Church which is reserved for Servers.*

Hand Sanitizer: There is hand sanitizer available for use in the Church. It is located at entry to rear doors and gathering table. Also available at the Walter Baker Hall. Please wash your hands when entering and leaving the Church.

Collections: The collection containers will be on the font walls, just inside the church doors. Collection bags are **NOT** to be passed around.

Face Masks: To be worn at Mass including upon entering and when leaving.

Singing: Chanting is permitted during our services however it is asked you still refrain from singing. The Cantor is to sing alone.
