

# **Reflection - Fr Lourduswamy**



Today we are looking up to the scripture for the feast of Pentecost, the story of Pentecost comes from Acts Ch 2 that is when the early disciples were gathered together, when the Holy Spirit poured out upon them. What happened to them that day changed their lives, changed their role, it gave strength. We know confirmation is our day of Pentecost that is the day the work of the Holy Spirit is completed. Also the work of Baptism is completed in our lives, and we received courage, power to be true authentic both in what we say and what we do. What is interesting about the reading is that a powerful reading in Act contrasted is in John ch 19 right up to Mary Magdalene

sees the Lord and comes to report to the others it is where they are and what they are doing that my caught my attention. On the evening of that day.... (read passage, Jn 20: 19-23).

It is interesting disciples were behind closed doors. We too are brought down behind closed door during locked down due to this invisible Corona virus also we brought down behind our closed door of our hearts from many fears.. of what? sickness, timid, fear of others, fear of future etc,. Interesting to note that the reading of Acts ch 2 is all about is freeing us really be people of God for what we are called to be. He says Peace be with you. Here peace be with you in the midst of fear behind closed door is very free. When we hear the word Peace we are not talking about just a sense of wellbeing but we are talking about a complete wellbeing, an inner wellbeing a Peace only comes from God from behind closed doors. This word PEACE is very much need of the day when we are griped with so many fears around and within us. And I hope you hear that word today. Jesus also says something very interesting As the Father sent me so I am going to send you, you may remember in the Gospel Mt 3 Jesus began his public ministry at the river Jordan by going down into the water of baptism after he came out of the water of baptism he experienced the confirmation the Holy spirit came upon him and empowered him to begin his public ministry. So just as Jesus began his ministry, we begin to minister in this world we begin to be Christ in this world.

The key word is **Pentecost**, is that power from Jesus so that we can do the work for which he has called us to do. He is giving us the Holy Spirit. Holy spirit is not a thing but is person, we also know Holy Spirit is one who accompany us in our lives, gives us the power to be a witnesses to come out of our locked doors as the disciples came out boldly from closed doors. Are you behind the closed doors for any reason? So in this week look for opportunity, opportunity for you to come from behind door a shut door, empowered by the PEACE from the Lord, to go out into the world and proclaim Christ. He will give you that opportunity and also give you the power to be that authentic true witness, in everything you say and in everything you do. Think of that day of your confirmation. He continues to work in your lives.

# First reading Acts 2:1-11 © They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak

When Pentecost day came round, they had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'
