The Morals and Values of Jesus

Encouraging children and young people to develop a relationship with Jesus is key to Catholic SRE. The curriculum used by Catholic SRE teachers aims to help children and young people make moral choices that are life-giving for themselves and others. Through the exploration of the teachings of Jesus, the stories in the Christian Scriptures, and by encouraging students to encounter Jesus in prayer, Catholic SRE aims to provide children and young people with a framework to help them make choices that recognise the value and importance of our relationship with God, others and our world.

A Pathway for Catholic Sacraments

Catholic SRE teachers liaise with the local Catholic parishes to ensure that students and their families are aware of the Sacramental programs being offered locally. Children attending Catholic SRE classes receive lessons that complement parish sacramental preparation.

WHAT IS CCD AND CCRESS? WHERE CAN I FIND OUT MORE?

The work of Catholic SRE teachers is the responsibility of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) in each Catholic Diocese of NSW. Together they are represented by the peak body CCRESS (Catholic Conference of Religious Educators in State Schools). CCRESS works to ensure that the Catholic Church provides authorised quality curriculums, resources and Catholic SRE teacher training so that SRE continues to be valued as a strength of Public Education by the approximately 300,00 students and their families who choose SRE for their kids.

WHAT IS IT?



Information for Parents

WHAT IS SRE?

SRE is the time set aside in NSW public schools which allows parents from all faith backgrounds the choice to have their children formed in the faith of their family. It is mandated by the NSW Education Act, 1990.

WHAT IS CATHOLIC SRE?

Catholic SRE is taught to Catholic students in public schools by SRE teachers from the local Catholic Church. Catholic children are taught about building a relationship with Jesus and understanding his message of love and forgiveness.

WHY IS SRE TAUGHT?

The Catholic Church sees the education of Catholic children in the Christian faith as integral and key to its mission. The NSW Department of Education sees SRE as an integral part of school activities that promotes a well-rounded education that values and supports the intellectual, creative, physical, social, emotional and spiritual development of each child.*

WHO ARE CATHOLIC SRE TEACHERS?

Catholic SRE teachers (also referred to as Catechists) are volunteers who are authorised and trained by their local Diocese of the Catholic Church. SRE can only be provided by a religious group approved by the Department of Education. The Catholic Church is an Approved Provider of SRE and the curriculum outlines are publicly available.

WHAT IS TAUGHT?

Catholic SRE teaching programs are approved by the Bishop of each Diocese, in liaison with educational experts, for use by Catholic SRE teachers. Approved SRE curricula contain age-appropriate lessons for children from Kindergarten to Year 12. PARISH INFORMATION

With approval from schools, Catholic SRE Teachers will often inform the children about Sunday Mass times and other special Church celebrations. There may also be special celebrations held at school. For example, during Education Week, at Easter and Christmas, a religious service may be held at the school for students who attend SRE.

HOW CAN YOUR CHILD ATTEND SRE?

Your child is welcome to attend Catholic SRE classes at their school. Parents/carers nominate what religious faith and/or denomination they wish their child to attend when they enrol their child at the school. Parents also have the right to change the SRE class their child attends at any time or withdraw them from SRE. This can be done by notifying the principal of your child's school in writing.
