We pray for all who have lost jobs and livelihoods. May their hardship be eased by appreciative community support. (Pray in silence)

We pray for all students and teachers may they manage they resume their work with wisdom, confidence and enthusiasm. (Pray in silence)

We pray for all who suffered severe loss in the summer bushfires but are yet to receive relief funds. May they hold fast to their hope for recovery. (Pray in silence)

We pray for the recently deceased, . . . , and for those whose anniversary of death occurs around this time. May they be raised up in the power of the Holy Spirit. (Pray in silence)

God of all grace, you never cease to renew us in spirit. Free us from fear and self-concern and set us on the path of joyful love. We ask this through Christ, our risen Lord.
