
## Reflections & Prayers for 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time



Who do people say the Son of Man is?
'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God'.
You are Peter, the rock on which I will build my
Church; the gates of hell will not hold out against it.
What begins with a simple question ends with the building of the church! At the center is the revelation of Jesus as 'the Christ, the Son of the living God.' The Church can be solidly built only on the person of Jesus; the Church can stand firmly only by faith in him.

At this point we are about halfway through this longer

period of Ordinary Time, a time for deepening our understanding of the identity of Jesus and deepening our identity as Church.

There is a tendency to think of faith in Jesus only as a personal commitment. The gospel reminds us that faith finds its deepest expression in the community of the Church. Brisbane Liturgia
