# **CATECHISTS AND COMPASSION**

There was also a group of enthusiastic Catechists who taught at the three schools at Woy Woy, Umina and Ettalong. Catechists everywhere are a noble breed and have provided the Church with an army of informed,

loving carers for children who otherwise would hear little or nothing of our Saviour. Woy Woy was blessed in having Joyce Ragan, Leila Young, Tom Malone, Margaret Hennessy and June Minogue to mention just a few. Others joined the ranks over the years and have continued the spirit of selfless generosity.

Mary Smith hosted the first of the gatherings for the sick. Bishop Muldoon was visiting the Parish and came to maty's house and in his larger than life way, comforted and prayed over all the guests. Gatherings for the sick and shut ins have continued much to the joy of those who have welcomed the opportunity of the Sacrament of the sick, their special mass and the convivium that followed.

Father Baker was called to his reward on Boxing Day 1973. He had been to a Christmas Tea with the Tonkins and returned about 9.30pm, stopping at his






associates door holding a wrapped gift saying "There is a 'prezzi' from 'Dezzi' (the Lady Decima Tonkin). He telephoned a Christmas greeting to Fr Leo Mahon, who was to succeed him as Parish Priest. He went off to bed and died during the night. St John the Baptist Church was packed for the parish Mass celebrated on the evening of Boxing Day as a tearful people came to say farewell to a Pastor who had served Woy Woy for 27 years, whose sermons had charmed and informed them as he recalled stories of his visits to many shrines, his stay in Rome and his deep knowledge of Sacred Scripture. The funeral Mass was to follow a few days later celebrated by Cardinal Freeman and sixty Priests.

#### A Catechist's Story

My name is Dunstan Berenger, my journey to becoming a Catechist began back in the mid 1980's during a conversation with work colleagues, when the topic turned to religion, a member of the group made the comment "if you want to learn more about your religion, try teaching it". When it came around to me for a response, I said "when I retire, maybe".

In 2014 we moved up to the Central Coast, and in that same year I retired. Coincidentally, in the Parish Bulletin there was a request for volunteer Catechists over a number of weeks. I then recalled that conversation of the 1980's, and contacted the Parish Coordinator to find out what this ministry entailed.

To my surprise, the procedure to becoming a Catechist wasn't too onerous and I commenced my training. Initially, as a helper in the classroom and a short time later took on solo teaching. The support and resources from the Diocese is excellent and encourages me to continue in this ministry.

On a personal level, it has given me a greater appreciation for my faith and also the opportunity of sharing this with the children in the classroom, makes this ministry worthwhile

before us" which "stands in sharp contrast with the emphasis on the individual that has until now pervaded our times".





# Gospel: Mk 9:38-43, 45, 47-48



At that time, John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." Jesus replied, "Do not



prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us. Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward. "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut if off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna, where 'their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched."
