#### YEAR OF ST. FRANCIS DE SALES

Every year we celebrate for a specific purpose in Celebrating the Feast Day mind to commemorate the special events in the life of the Congregation. Our Superior

General of the Congregation Rev. Fr. Abraham Vettuvelil has declared the year 2022 as the year of St. Francis de Sales beginning from

Divine Mercy Sunday on 24th April 2022 till the next

year's Divine Mercy Sunday 16th April 2023.

Our Superior General has outlined some special programs at the Congregational level and they are as follows:

- Pope Francis has agreed to write a letter on SFS this year to mark the 400th death anniversary (12-28-1622 – 12-28-2022).
- Wednesdays with St. Francis de Sales: every Wednesday from April 27, nearly 13 congregations and lay associates are participating in giving a 5-minute reflection on the spirituality of St. Francis de sales.
- Celebrations in Annecy, France (organized by Franco-Swiss Province) inviting confreres 3. from all over Europe.
- A short documentary on SFS and a special calendar for 2023. 5. Starting the formation program for Fransalian Associates (lay order) in all the provinces in view of their consecration in January 2024. 6. On December 28, 2022 (death date of SFS) we want to do something at the Congregational level to reach out to the people in need of

support.

Many more other programs in the pipe line at the level of provinces, vice province and regions under the guidance of the General administration, provincials and the ad hock committee formed to monitor and implement the decisions taken in view of the special year to pay our loving tribute to our patron. One of St. Francis de Sales principal concern was to touch the hearts of the people and lead them to God. This is what happens to one who reads his life journey and the masterpieces that he has written to guide people to holiness. #### **Liturgy Reflection**

EASTER IS THE TIME when we both remember and celebrate the new life which has come to us through our Risen Lord. What do we mean by this "new life"? Can you say that you have experienced this "new life" this Easter or, for that matter, in any previous Easter? Are you aware of becoming changed in any way - for the better - over the years? Or has the Easter

experience simply passed you by?
The word "new" appears several times in today's readings. The passage from Revelation speaks of a "new" heaven, a "new" earth and a "new" Jerusalem. Jesus in the Gospel speaks of a "new" commandment. What's supposed to be "new"?

The "new life" that the Scripture speaks of is also referred to as "conversion", a turning round, First Friday of the month during Mass at or, in Greek metanoia. It means a radical change of vision, of our priorities in life. It means new attitudes, new values, new standards of relating with God and with people and indeed with our whole living environment of which we are a synergistic part.

In the Gospel Jesus speaks of the foundation and heart of his teaching and message. These are his parting words to his disciples before he goes to his passion and death. What is this message? Is it to be faithful in keeping the Ten Commandments and leading a moral life? Not exactly. Does he warn us to be sure to be in church every Sunday and to go to confession regularly? Not really. Does he tell us to use all our energies in loving God? Surprisingly, perhaps, no!

What he does tell us is to love other people – and to love them as he has loved us. This, he says, is a "new" commandment. The Hebrew Testament told us to love God with our whole heart and soul and so on; and to love our neighbours as ourselves. Jesus has added a new element in telling us that the true test of discipleship is to love other people in the same way that he has loved us. And we might remember that these words lead the way to the "greatest possible love" that a person can show, that is, by letting go of one's very life for others. This Jesus will very dramatically portray in the terrible suffering and degradation which he will submit to out of love for us, out of love for ME

### LITURGY OF THE WORD

#### Reading I: <u>Acts 14:21-27</u>

After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to that city and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch. They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith. Then they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia. From there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished. And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.
