TRAINING AND FORMATION (Maintaining Accreditation)

Initial Training for Newly Recruited Catechists and Helpers

Compulsory

CCD Ministry Induction Course (CCD MI)

CCD MI course is compulsory training for all new catechists and helpers and those returning to teach after an extended break from teaching. It consists of 8 x 2-hour units presented in face-to-face mode or on Zoom. ¹ The Safeguarding unit must be completed before catechists can go into a school. The other 7 sessions can be completed over the next 6 months. Some units are also available in an online learning mode.

Elective

Level One Course - Tools for Ministry

This course consists of 6 x 2-hour units, and is complementary to the CCD MI. The units offered are 'tools for the CCD ministry' presenting teaching strategies for the classroom to new and returning catechists.

Ongoing Training for All Catechists and Helpers

Compulsory

- Safeguarding/Child Protection
- Classroom Management
- Authorised Curriculum

The NSW Department of Education requires ongoing training in three topic areas. Each unit is continually updated and must be completed every three years.

Electives

Level Two Course - The Church in the Third Millennium

This course consists of 12 x 2-hour units. Units offered cover the teachings of the Catholic Church. It is open to catechists and helpers. Other people interested in ministry training are also welcome.



¹ Exemptions may be applied for on the basis of prior learning and/or experience in ministry.

Level Three Course – Faith in Ministry

This consists of 12 x 2-hour units; however, unit numbers may vary depending on the topic.

This adult faith formation course is open to catechists, helpers and other interested people.

Certification and Accreditation

A full authorisation card is awarded on successful completion of the CCDMI. A Level One certificate is award upon completion of the CCD MI and the additional six units of the Level 1 training. A Level 2 certificate is awarded following the completion of all 12 units of Level 2. A Diploma in Special Religious Education is awarded upon the successful completion of all three levels of CCD ministry training.
