We monks feel close to today's Gospel Acclamation: Open our heart, O Lord, to accept the words of your Son. We ask for this grace every day, several times a day. Remaining open to Christ is not easy, because we must subdue some of our human instincts to judge or to place our minds on less worthy enterprises. Remaining open is our key to develop into Christ's love, to attain the kingdom of Heaven. We monks have also made sacrifices. We read today's Gospel and wonder at the apparent ruthlessness of Jesus's words. But let us look at Christ's sacrifice. It was by no means half-hearted and he did it for us.

There are many sacrifices we can make each day for the love of God, that we may remain open. Being the receptors of God's love is what we are created for. Picking up his message on the wavelengths of humanity and nature, and making ourselves open to him... This is our life's work.


If we are to find this new way of living according to Christ, some of what we do must fall by the wayside. We must reassess our priorities. When we pray, we may ask ourselves what it is that we can leave behind, what it is that we can redact in order to let Jesus into our hearts. And also, what more we can do, what we can take on. Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows:

'Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me is not worthy of me.

Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me.

Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find

Reading 1: 2 Kgs 4:8-11, 14-16

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there."
