

JESUS IS RISEN! ALLELUIA!



On Easter Sunday, the Church proclaims the resounding message: "Jesus, who was crucified, has risen as he said. Alleluia!" These darkest days of mindless, violence, catastrophic destruction and incredibly savage massacres call us urgently to be echoes of the Easter event. The Easter message does not offer us a fantasy to escape from the difficult human situations that we experience from the moment of birth to death. The Resurrection of Christ reveals the reality of God's New Creation and New life that is indispensable to

transform our broken world. Easter gives us the power of faith to go beyond the humanly possible. During overwhelming loss, it gives courage to struggle against the odds.

How much suffering, how much injustice, how much senseless violence has been inflicted on the innocent. "Jesus who was crucified has risen". The Gospel testifies that this Jesus, crucified under Pontius Pilate for claiming he was the Christ, the Son of God, rose on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, just as he had assured his disciples.

God the Father raised Jesus, his Son, because he fully accomplished his saving will. Jesus bore the wounds of sufferings for the weight of our sins. All those who experience a painful trial in body or spirit can find refuge in these wounds and, through them, receive the grace of a hope that never disappoints.

The risen Christ is hope for everyone, especially the weak and the most vulnerable among us. Today, we too, can open ourselves to resurrection power, and let it flow through us to all creation. In the light, warmth and solace of the Risen Lord, our sufferings are transfigured. Where there was death, now there is life. Where there was mourning, now there is consolation. Where there was darkness, now there is light. In embracing the Cross, Jesus bestowed meaning on our sufferings. We pray that the benefits of that healing will spread throughout the world. A Happy, Holy and serene Easter to each one of you. God bless you!

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Reading 1: Acts 10:34, 37-43

Peter proceeded to speak and said: “You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name.”

Gospel: Jn 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, “They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don’t know where they put him.” So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.
