Jesus Calls

I n John 1:35-42, we see the story of Jesus calling his first disciples -Andrew and Simon Peter. Andrew was initially a disciple of John the Baptist, but when he heard John proclaim Jesus as the Lamb of God, he immediately went to find his brother Simon and bring him to Jesus. This passage portrays a beautiful example of the importance of teaching others about Jesus and his teachings.

As parents and caregivers, it is our responsibility to introduce our children to the love and teachings of Jesus. Just as Andrew felt compelled to share the good news of Jesus with his brother, we too should encourage our children to share their faith with others. By teaching our children about Jesus and his teachings, we are helping them develop a strong foundation of faith that they can carry with them throughout their lives.

Furthermore, this passage shows the importance of community in nurturing and sustaining our faith. Andrew did not keep the good news of Jesus to himself - he shared it with his brother and brought him to meet Jesus. Similarly, we should encourage our children to be a part of a community of believers, where they can find support, encouragement, and opportunities to grow in their faith.

Catechists play a vital role in passing on the teachings of the Church and helping others grow in their faith. As a disciple, we invite you to consider this ministry to teach Catholic students in our state schools about Jesus. We share his glory in glorying in what we are called to be and in what each person we meet is called to be.


