Like the nine lepers who didn't think it necessary to thank Jesus for the healing received, many of us take for granted our innumerable everyday blessings! We seem to move about with a sense of entitlement convinced we are deserving of the blessings received. True happiness lies not in what we receive, but in how we receive. As is evident from Jesus' commendation, 'your faith has saved you', the thankful Samaritan had understood the full meaning of what he had experienced. St Ignatius of Loyola says, 'Gratitude is an attitude that keeps us aware of how we are blessed and who it is that blesses us.' No doubt, all ten lepers had cried out in faith, 'Jesus, Master, take pity on us'. But only one felt inclined to show gratitude. When in trouble or pain we, like the lepers, desperately seek God and when help does come, be it through family, neighbour or friend, do we bother to thank God and that person? Or do we simply take it for granted, saying, 'Oh! He or she was just doing their duty'. Today let us take the time to recall gratefully ten miracles God has wrought in our lives! Lord, let your touch warm us and heal us.

Deacon Tony Hoban Joins our Parish!

Deacon Tony Hoban was ordained for the Diocese of Parramatta almost 16 years ago. He served as Deacon for eight years at Christ the King Parish, North Rocks. He and his wife, Annette, were then asked by Bishop Vincent Long to establish a new Catholic Faith Community in Marsden Park in 2018; they led this community for seven years, until the end of 2024. They are now residing in Blue Bay and have just returned from motorhome travels covering northern NSW, Queensland, the Northern Territory and parts of South Australia and Victoria, clocking up more than 15,000kms. They have three married adult children (a son, Jamie, and twin daughters, Lisa and Julia) and two granddaughters, with their first grandson due



this month. Deacon Tony is a former Vicar for Deacons in the Diocese of Parramatta and currently is the President of the Australian Catholic Deacons Association, Deputy President of the International Diaconate Centre and Deputy Chair of Kairos Prison Ministry, Australia.

Give Thanks

Joni Mitchell, the great singer-songwriter, wrote, "You don't know what you've got 'til it's gone." In a single line, she captured the unfortunate reality that we all take so many things for granted. Instead of being aware of, and grateful for, what we have, we often only appreciate things when they're missing – or perhaps when we've lost someone or something.

We can say the same about the practice of gratitude – we really recognise its importance when we experience its absence or its opposite. There's something beautiful about gratitude, just as there's something ugly about ingratitude or an arrogant sense of entitlement. Maybe you've had the experience of being taken for granted, or having your generosity or effort accepted as if it were no big deal. If you've had that happen to you, then you'll know how hurtful ingratitude can be. Even though our motivation for doing things is not to receive thanks or praise, when we meet with ingratitude, then our gift can be somehow spoiled.

Today's Gospel story of the ten lepers is a great illustration of how important actually expressing our gratitude is. "One of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks." This man expresses his gratitude at the top of his voice, happy for all to hear. There's no mumbled, embarrassed, offhand, "thanks a lot" or "cheers, mate!" His thanksgiving is evident to everyone as he throws himself at Jesus' feet in humble praise. He has no qualms about letting the world know that something wonderful, unexpected and undeserved has happened. His thanksgiving is wholehearted and joyful, and he freely recognises that he owes the Lord a huge debt of gratitude. He realises that God is present and active both in his healing and in the person of Jesus, the one who healed him by the power of God.

This can be our approach in life, too. After all, everything we have and are comes to us as an undeserved gift from God, not because we've earned it or are entitled to it. As the Trappist monk Thomas Merton said, "To be grateful is to recognise the love of God in everything he has given us – and God has given us everything. Every breath we draw is a gift of God's love, every moment of existence is a grace, for it brings with it immense graces from God."
