## Anchored in Hope

Last Christmas, Pope Francis was the first ever Pope to open a Holy Door in a prison. He had first opened the Holy Door in St Peter's Basilica in Rome, marking the official beginning of the year of Jubilee in the Catholic Church. He had announced the Jubilee in a document called *Spes non confundit* ('Hope does not disappoint'). "Christian hope does not deceive or disappoint", he wrote, "because it is grounded in the certainty that nothing and no one may ever separate us from God's love". But why did he choose to visit a prison? "During the Holy Year", he wrote, "we are called to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind. I think of prisoners who, deprived of their freedom, daily feel the harshness of detention and its restrictions, lack of affection and, in more than a few cases, lack of respect for their persons."

The Jubilee is about hope. Hope is not about distant unfulfilled dreams, but rather it is about perseverance in the face of immense difficulties. It is about continuing to believe even when circumstances feel overwhelming. On his visit to the prison, Pope Francis suggested that hope is like an anchor, tied with rope. "Sometimes", he said, "the rope is hard, and it hurts our hands. Yet even in these moments, the anchor of hope keeps us moving forward."

## Look Again

If we look again at today's Gospel, we are called to continue to pray, not just for ourselves but for all our neighbours. To continue to pray is to continue to hope, just like the widow in the parable. If we switch the story round, though, so that we don't put ourselves in the place of the widow, but in the place of the judge, what do we see? Do we have eyes to see and respond to those who are living in poverty and exclusion? Are the widows, orphans and strangers of today important to us – do we answer our door when they knock?

Pope Francis linked evangelisation to hope and also to patience. "We come to realise", he said, "that evangelisation is sustained by the power flowing from Christ's cross and resurrection. In this way, we learn to practise a virtue closely linked to hope, namely patience. In our fast-paced world, we are used to wanting everything now. We no longer have time simply to be with others; even families find it hard to get together and enjoy one another's company."

The call to prayer is a call to pay attention. We are asked not to forget those who are on the margins of our society, those who are poor, hungry or in prison. We are now approaching the end of the Jubilee Year. It is a good time to review how we have approached the challenge of becoming tangible signs of hope in the world.

## Introducing our New Parish Logo

Fr Brian and the Parish Pastoral Council have commissioned a new Logo for our parish. We are very happy with the symbolism displayed. The logo demonstrates the following aspects:

- 1. Our bell tower with the cross represents a lighthouse, the Cross being Christ as the Beacon. *John 8:12*
- Three beams of light: not only represent the Trinity but also our message of being a Beacon of Faith, Hope and Love.
  1 Corinthians 13:13
- 3. Waves of water: of the Pacific Ocean and the ripples of Tuggerah Lake that surround us. *Matthew 8:23-27, Mark 4:35-41* and *Luke 8:22-25*
- 4. The colour blue: associated with the Virgin Mary, symbolising her purity and her unique connection to the divine.
