Enveloped in the Peace of God

We all long for peace on earth. Despite our best efforts, however, our communities are often marked by conflict and violence. This situation leads us to the humbling recognition that peace on earth is somehow beyond the unaided capabilities of human beings. We must acknowledge that peace is God's gift. We must work for peace, yes, but we must also pray for the peace of Jerusalem, for peace in our homes and among our loved ones. Nations will hammer their swords into ploughshares and their spears into sickles only when they are willing to submit their disputes to the wise judgement of God.

Peace is the fruit of union with God. Like the tribes of Israel who went on pilgrimage to the temple in Jerusalem, we also need to make pilgrimage to God. We must journey away from self-centred preoccupations to God. Like the people Jesus mentions in today's Gospel, we can so easily get caught up in the affairs of life and forget God completely.

We must journey to God, but the wonderful message of Advent is that he journeys to us first. We marvel at the God who came to us as a babe at Bethlehem, who is among us now in word and sacrament and community, and who will come again in glory at the end of time. On that day the peace of God, which we experience partially now, will envelop us fully.

Today Matters

There is a story about a clock that was very anxious about the future, its mind always looking forward. It ticked twice every second, 120 times a minute, 7,200 an hour, 172,800 a day, and 63,000,000 a year. That would be 630,000,000 ticks in ten years! At the thought, the clock collapsed due to nervous exhaustion. But when it came to its senses, the clock realised that it was silly to tick twice every second - once was enough. It only needed to act one at a time.

As the Church begins a new liturgical year with Advent, the word of God directs us to the importance of the "now" in contrast with the past and the future. Today matters, and we must see the value of redefining the past and defining the future by identifying ourselves with the present. We must live our days one day at a time.

In the Gospel, Jesus emphasises the significance of our "today," of our now. He compares his contemporaries with those who lived in Noah's days. Those who perished in the Great Flood wasted their today in petty and passing pleasures. They became careless with the things of God and failed to work for their salvation. Jesus does not want us to suffer the same fate. He calls us to watchfulness: "Stay awake!"

The summons to be watchful, to be "ready" or "prepared" (Hebrew, hetoimoi), is also a call to be alert, to be attentive - every second, every minute, one at a time - to God's will for us today. Besides being watchful, the apostle Paul urges us to "put on the armour of light" (v 12). It means that the grace we received in Baptism must bear fruit in our conscious life. This is the path towards the "days to come" that Isaiah prophesied in the First Reading. The prophet saw the coming of a new and peaceful order in the future, and this is only possible if we "put on the Lord Jesus Christ" (v 14) today.

As we prepare to celebrate the coming of the Lord, let us remember the significance of our today. Let us discern and be conscious of God's plan for us that we may not fail to respond to this plan today. 366 Days with the Lord Fr Gil Alinsangan SSP

Communion Under Both Kinds

Those wishing to receive the Chalice need to line up on the left-hand aisle for the Host then go to the left to receive the Chalice. As is the Church custom the minister will give you the Chalice to consume a small amount of the Precious Blood and then you will hand it back to the minister.

N.B. After the minister says 'The Body of Christ', or 'The Blood of Christ' we reply with: 'Amen'.

A reminder that the Church allows us to receive the Host either on the hand or on the tongue. If receiving on the hand, please place your hand well out in front of you for the minister to place the host upon. If receiving on the tongue, please open your mouth wide enough and place your tongue out so that the minister does not contaminate their hand with saliva.
