The Dignity of the Church

The Passover for the Jews was an important social and religious annual event. The temple court used to be very crowded and looked like a market place. Business was brisk in Jerusalem with the Passover lasting for one week. Many Jews went to the Holy City to fulfill their obligations and celebrate their religious traditions. Different kinds of animals were used for the holocausts and sacrifices. The pagan coins, brought from the diaspora by Jewish and Gentile pilgrims, had to be exchanged for the Jewish shekel, the only currency acceptable for temple offering and tax. The trade was legitimised by the temple authorities.

Jesus did not appreciate this. He reacts to it violently and cleanses the temple, driving the merchants out and overturning their tables, as a sign of purification of the temple where God dwells. Jesus is not advocating violence or destruction. He questions the ritualistic worship in which the hearts of the people are far away from God and the wanton disrespect of a holy place. Hence the disciples apply these words of Scripture "Zeal for your house will consume me," (Ps 69:10) to Jesus.

Today we celebrate the dedication of the Lateran Basilica. When we think about the Church in Rome we have an image of St Peter's in the Vatican. But however important and imposing St Peter's is, it gives way to a smaller building in Rome, a few kilometres outside the Vatican, the Lateran Basilica. The church itself is the oldest in Rome and dates from the year 324. It was the cathedral for each Bishop of Rome, who was of course, the pope. For centuries the popes lived in the Lateran Palace next door. Although it's had its share of damage and reconstruction over the centuries, the Lateran Basilica is still, if we like to think of it this way, the pope's parish church and it's honoured as the Mother Church of all the churches in the world.

While of course we must look after our church buildings, it does not matter whether we're in a sumptuous basilica or in a grass hut with rain dripping onto the simple table that serves as an altar. It is the same Christ our Saviour who offers himself with us to the Father and gives us back his own life in Communion.

Communion Under Both Kinds

Bishop Anthony has instructed that in Broken Bay Diocese from the Feast of Christ the King (23 November) each parish will make Communion under both kinds available at each Mass celebration. We will slowly introduce this with 1 chalice only at this stage.

Those wishing to receive the Chalice need to line up on the left-hand aisle for the Host then go to the left to receive the Chalice. As is the church custom the minister will give you the Chalice to consume a small amount of the Precious Blood and then you will hand it back to the minister.

N.B. After the minister says 'The Body of Christ', or 'The Blood of Christ' we reply with: 'Amen'.

A reminder that the church allows us to receive the Host either on the hand or on the tongue. If receiving on the hand, please place your hand clearly out in front of you for the minister to place the host upon. If receiving on the tongue, please open your mouth wide enough and place your tongue out so that the minister does not contaminate their hand with saliva.
