We are Sent

The experience of being anointed and sent by God for a specific purpose is something the prophet Isaiah took up in deeply practical ways. Sent to the poor, the broken, captives and the imprisoned, Isaiah, like the saints, becomes a sign for us - pointing the way to both our journey and destination: finding Jesus in those to whom we're called, and actively accompanying them into union with him. They live in our midst, but often they are us.

Just think of the many people who are spiritually poor, captive to a culture which says that they have no need for an intimate, personal, life-giving relationship with Jesus (curiously, this can even sometimes be faithful Mass-goers). We are surrounded by broken relationships in our families and communities. Many people are imprisoned by a slavery to screen-time. The poor are in our midst, we are sent to them, and we are them.

Lord, help me to grasp the call you have placed on my life; that I may use the gifts you have given me to serve, give and accompany others into relationship with your Son, Jesus. Amen.

In God's Good Time

M any of today's Christians worry about the loss of faith within their families and within society. The statistics are not encouraging – the faith and practice of previous generations seem, in some senses, to be disappearing. It requires considerable faith and self-effacement on our part to prepare the ground for the faith journey of others without having any reassurance that this will ultimately prove successful.

For some of our family, friends and neighbours, we ourselves will be the only Gospel that they ever read, the only sermon they will ever hear. It's not so much a question of thinking up clever and convincing arguments as of living our faith genuinely and convincingly. We may not always be able to use overtly religious language with those who are unable to accept it, but within the widest implications of our living justly, loving tenderly and walking humbly, there lie the seeds of faith, waiting to grow in God's good time and in ways that perhaps only God can see. The Fourth Eucharistic Prayer prays for "all who seek you with a sincere heart... and all the dead, whose faith you alone have known". Faith is found and fostered in many hidden ways. The challenge to us is to have confidence in God's call even when we cannot see the proof.

Every baptised person shares in the threefold ministry of Christ as prophet, priest and king. We are prophetic when our faiths open up paths of faith for others. We are priestly when we affirm the sacredness of life in every human person and in our universe, and we are proclaimers of the kingdom when we do justice in all our social and personal relationships. That is how Advent is lived within the world.

St Francis' Crib

le celebrate Christmas in many splendid ways. One of the first items $f{V}$ to appear in our homes, churches, schools and workplaces as Christmas approaches is a Christmas nativity scene, often in the form of a crib or creche. The Nativity scene now recreated in city squares and churches worldwide was originally conceived by St. Francis of Assisi. However, nativity scenes have been found in early Christian catacombs in Rome and can be traced to AD 380. It is more accurate to say that Francis popularised the first live Christmas creche, for Francis loved Christmas. Thomas of Celano, the earliest biographer of St Francis of Assisi wrote: 'the birthday of the Child Jesus Francis observed with inexpressible eagerness over all other feasts, saying that it was the feast of feasts, on which God, having become a tiny infant, clung to human breasts' (2 Celano, 199). In 1223 Francis wanted to celebrate Christmas in a special way. Francis and some of the Brothers were staying near the little village of Greccio, Italy. Blessed Francis summoned one of the brothers: "If you desire to celebrate the coming feast of the Lord together, hurry before me and carefully make ready the things I tell you. For I wish to enact the memory of that Babe who was born in Bethlehem: to see as much as possible with my own bodily eyes the discomfort of his infant needs, how he lay in a manger, and how, with an ox and an ass standing by, he rested in hay." 
