

Actively Awaiting

Jesus uses a number of vigorous verbs in this Gospel to describe the behaviour he wants to see as we await his coming: we are to 'be alert', to 'be awake'. These are all applied to our ordinary existence. Yes, the daily round that doesn't seem important in the eyes of the world is precious in the eyes of God as it is in daily life that the kingdom of God is unfolding for us. We do not drift into this kingdom or find ourselves within by default. God wants us to actively and effectively participate in making his kingdom a reality in our world. It takes great daily courage to take these words to heart but when we do our lives, our often very humble lives, attain a meaning and depth that cannot come from human sources. Judgement will be made, not upon what presentation we may be able to drum up at the last minute, but rather on what we do day-by-day when no-one is around. When we trust the plan that God has for our lives, the grace of the Spirit opens our eyes to infinite vistas in the confined spaces of our daily life.

Looking Forward

We are waiting for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed. 1 CO 1:7

Based on life expectancy, we can surmise that this Advent is one of probably 70 or 80 which we will each experience. For children, Advent and Christmas are times of wonder. As adults though, it can become routine and repetitive. There may not be a lot to distinguish this Advent from past Advents.

Looking into the future, the view is different. Amid our Christmas preparations, the Church invites us to heed two more "advents" of God which are just around the corner - first when we die, and then again when Jesus returns. Neither of those will be routine or repetitive!

Advent gets us into the habit of looking forward. Our Lord wants us to foster this habit, constantly preparing to see God who draws ever closer. Death can be likened to Jesus approaching us from behind and tapping us on the shoulder. He wants us to turn around and greet him with joy and affection, not begging for more time.

So, for the next four weeks, we take the Bethlehem shepherds and Magi as our guides. We imagine ourselves travelling with them, preparing to meet Jesus. When Christmas arrives, the Lord should find us ready to receive him, and equally prepared for the other two Advents in our future.

At the end of my life on earth O Lord, grant me the resolve to run forth to meet you with the wonder and joy of a child on Christmas morning. Amen.

Twofold Coming

oday the Church begins the season of Advent which is divided into two parts: from the first Sunday to 16 December we prepare for the future coming of Jesus and from 17 to 24 December we recall his historical coming. The Church is a pilgrim Church. It journeys between this twofold coming of Jesus. During this journey the Church, like any other pilgrim, goes through a threefold experience of loneliness, hope and watchful waiting. In moments of crisis and struggles we feel that we have been abandoned by God. It is not that God has deserted us but we have forgotten or ignored his presence with us. Even in such situations we have to believe that another world is possible. It is only those who see the invisible who can do the impossible. We ought to hope for the intervention of the Lord and wait for it patiently, just as the Church waits vigilantly for the second coming of the Lord. As we begin the season of Advent and a new Liturgical Year today let us ask the Lord to grant us a deep sense of security and assurance during our journey of faith, a journey towards a new world of love, joy and peace.
