Who Was John the Baptist?

It's really impossible to grasp the significance of Jesus without passing through the cleansing bath of John the Baptist. He provides a lens through which Jesus is properly interpreted.

John, Matthew tells us, made his appearance as a preacher in the desert of Judea. Deserts are places of simplicity and poverty, places where distractions and attachments are eliminated - and hence where the voice of God can be heard. Wealth, pleasure, power, honour - and all of their avatars and priests - are shouting at us, luring us, tempting us. But what is God saying? We have to go to these silent and deserted places in order to hear.

What's the first word out of the prophet's mouth? "Repent." This might be a dirty word to many people today, but it cuts to the heart of every one of us, precisely because we all know that our lives are not where they are supposed to be. We have all fallen short of the glory of God; we have all fallen into patterns of self-absorption and addiction. So let us hear John's word today: "Repent." It's a command to turn around, to start moving in a new direction.

Fruits of Repentance

On this second Sunday of Advent we find John the Baptist preparing the people of Israel to receive Jesus, the promised Messiah. The key word in his preaching is 'repentance', which appears three times in today's passage. True repentance involves a radical turning away of the person from sin and turning towards God. It demands a new perspective about life and consequently a new way of life. John insists that this sort of repentance is necessary for anyone who wishes to share in the blessings and salvation that the Messiah would bring.

In these days when we are preparing to celebrate once again the Birthday of Jesus, a lifestyle that manifests true repentance is essential. In this context, the exhortation of John the Baptist is timely: bear fruit that befits repentance. John insists that anyone who is serious about repentance must demonstrate it externally through one's deeds. It is indeed one of the forceful teachings of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount. Do I believe that I need repentance? What fruits of repentance does God demand from me?

Decisive Moments

The important events in the life of St John the Baptist began before he was even born, as he leapt in his mother's womb at the arrival of Mary, the mother of his Saviour. This was the decisive moment in his life, as he would spend the whole of it preparing the way of the One who was greater than he was. To do this effectively he chose to live in the wilderness, dressing and behaving like one of the ancient prophets. His message was a simple one of total repentance; his targets being the Pharisees and the Sadducees, the accepted teachers of his time. His complaint, taken up by Jesus, was the hypocrisy of their lives. They said one thing and did another, all the time imposing harsh rules on their listeners. Here, John gives us an insight into one of the difficulties of dealing with life's challenges. From our earliest years we pick up messages about what is right and wrong. These messages are like the bedrock we return to, especially when we are stressed. They have great power over us. Part of the adventure of life is modifying these messages as our perception and understanding broaden. What does not help in either the initial stages or later is the contradiction of hypocrisy: saying one thing and doing another. John's advice, again seconded by Jesus, is, "Look at what they do, rather than listening to what they say."

Communion Under Both Kinds

Those wishing to receive the Chalice need to line up on the left-hand aisle for the Host then go to the left to receive the Chalice. As is the Church custom the minister will give you the Chalice to consume a small amount of the Precious Blood and then you will hand it back to the minister. N.B. After the minister says 'The Body of Christ', or 'The Blood of Christ' we reply with: 'Amen'.

A reminder that the Church allows us to receive the Host either on the hand or on the tongue. If receiving on the hand, please place your hand well out in front of you for the minister to place the host upon. If receiving on the tongue, please open your mouth wide enough and place your tongue out so that the minister does not contaminate their hand with saliva.

Advent 2nd Rite of Reconciliation


