

What Can I Do to Serve My Parish?

There are many outlets and avenues for you to explore, and most areas are in great need of assistance:

- Join the Choir! One of the easiest and most pleasurable ways to volunteer your talents for the Church is to join the choir. It is open to all with a desire and ability to make a joyful noise for the Lord. Choir practice is held Tuesdays at 5:30pm in the Church.
- Catechist or Helper – There are always vacancies for helpers and Catechists teaching our children in the State Schools. Training and materials are provided and it is most rewarding! Classes are half an hour once a week in school terms, so it doesn't require too much time, either. You'll find a dedicated team ready to welcome you and share their experiences and insights with you.

Following God's Law to Fullness of Life

Jesus reminds the disciples that he has not come to do away with the Law and the Commandments from the Old Testament. But he does encourage us to think about them again.

It is not enough to do the bare minimum – it is not enough *not* to murder. Jesus says here that even anger, or the mere thought of wrongdoing, is enough to set us on the wrong path. God, who knows and sees all that we do and think, is concerned not just with our actions, but also with what is in our heart.

We are called to be more righteous even than the scribes and the Pharisees. Jesus often held up the scribes and the Pharisees as people who followed the letter of the Law without really understanding the spirit of it. For example, in the parable of the Good Samaritan, they were more concerned about preserving their ritual cleanliness than helping the stranger in need. We all know people who are convinced of their own rightness. Perhaps sometimes even we fall into this trap, but it can lead us into a blind spot about how we are hurting or failing others. As the Second Reading says, the wisdom of our leaders is not the same as the wisdom of God.

Jesus calls us today, then, to be reconciled to our brother or sister before we make our offering to God. We need to look at the world around us, at our relationships with others and consider where we need to ask forgiveness.

Ash Wednesday and Paschal Precept

Lent begins this week from Ash Wednesday 18 February. Masses will be celebrated here at 9am and 6pm, and 10am at Reynolds Court Chapel. Abstinence from meat and fasting are to be observed on this day and Good Friday. Fasting means taking only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary according to one's needs, but solid foods between meals is not permitted. On all Fridays of Lent the law of common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing: Prayer - eg Mass, family prayer, a visit to a Church, reading the bible; Self-Denial - eg no eating sweets or dessert, giving up entertainment; and Helping Others - eg special attention to the poor, sick, lonely.

We are obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year, between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. And all of the faithful are obliged to confess their grave sins at least once a year.

Walking in the Wilderness Lenten resource calls us to a deeper experience of communion, participation and mission, growing in reverence for the sacred mystery of our faith and the Eucharist.
