Illuminating

In his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus compares his disciples to salt and light. Notice that these two realities exist not for themselves but for something else. In Jesus' time, salt was not valued for itself, but for the way it preserved meat and enhanced the flavour of other foods. Similarly, light isn't meant for itself; rather, we see things by it.

In our rather privatised culture, we tend to think of religion as something for ourselves; but on the Biblical reading, religiosity is like salt and light: it is meant not for oneself but for others.

Perhaps we can bring these two images together by saying that we find salvation for ourselves precisely in the measure that we bring God's life to others. Followers of Jesus are meant to be salt, which effectively preserves what is best in the society around them. And they are also light by which people around them come to see what is worth seeing.

By the very quality and integrity of our lives, we shed light, illuminating what is beautiful and revealing what is ugly. The implication is that, without vibrant Christians, the world is a much worse place.

First Fruits Offering

Through our parishes, Jesus invites each of us to take an active role in his Mission. We do this by offering our time, talents and treasure for the building up of his kingdom. God calls us to be generous with all our gifts. Stewardship means giving back to God in gratitude for all he has given us, including giving from our treasure.

We may often find ourselves throwing last minute donations into the collection basket, however, by creating a plan we can better share the gifts that God has given us. Giving from our treasure, our money, is a pillar of our faith – just like attending Sunday Mass or participating in parish ministries.

Here is a simple breakdown of where your donations go:

The First Collection or Clergy Giving supports the parish and assistant priest's expenses including a monthly stipend, food and household needs, health insurance and a contribution to the Bishop's Pastoral Mission.

The Second Collection or Parish Giving provides financial resources to operate, serve and minister to the parish through evangelisation, parish pastoral works, liturgical expenses, hospitality, parish staff salaries, Clergy superannuation, insurance, utilities, building maintenance, etc.

Planned Giving is a commitment to a regular financial gift to the Parish, Clergy or both. This can be made in person at the parish office, monthly on credit card, electronic funds transfer, via the donation button on our website or through direct debit arrangement. Electronically, there are several ways in which you can contribute but some incur higher fees than others. Transfer directly into our accounts incurs no fees and saves the parish. You may also like to consider a bequest to the parish in your will. Your generosity can have a huge impact on your parish's future.

Special Collections are also held throughout the year to support Appeals beyond the parish, including Pastoral Works Broken Bay, St Vincent de Paul, CatholicCare Homelessness Appeal and more.

The generosity of parishioners is deeply needed and always gratefully received.
