God is There

The Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain confirms that Jesus was in the presence of God. It also serves to clarify that Jesus is, indeed, God's Son. That Jesus is, indeed, confirmed in this is manifested by the voice from the cloud which, in words similar to those used at the Baptism, affirms Jesus as Son and slave. Jesus is both at the same time Son of God and Suffering Servant. He will, through his death, bring salvation to all. He is the fulfilment of all the hopes, not only of Israel, but of the whole world. He supersedes both Moses and Elijah. They are no longer needed now that Jesus has come.

The Transfiguration serves to emphasise that, though God will seem hidden at the passion and death of Jesus, and though Jesus might seem defeated, things are not as they seem. Rather, God is as present at the passion and death of Jesus as he was at the Transfiguration.

Jesus is as victorious in his passion and death as he was in his Transfiguration. In the First Reading of today, this is precisely the kind of confidence that Abram is challenged to have. He and his wife are old, they do not have even one son and yet, God commands him to believe that his descendants will be as numerous as the stars in the sky. Abram dared to believe, even when he could not understand, and it was so. He first believed and then, he saw.

The readings of today teach us an all important lesson. There are times in our lives when things do not go the way we plan, when all that we plan goes awry, when the road seems steep and the going is difficult, when every step that we take is laboured and arduous, when we cannot see or understand and, when we feel like giving up and giving in. It is at times like these that we, like Peter, wish we had stayed on the mountain. It is at times like these when we might like some tangible proof or some sign. Yet, the Transfiguration of Jesus teaches that God continues to walk ahead of us and, though we may not be able to see him as clearly as we would like, God is there. God's Word Fr Errol Fernandes SJ

Caterpillar or Butterfly?

In today's Gospel Reading the first four words of the Greek text have been omitted, and that is most unfortunate. These four words are: "And after six days." Six days after what? After the prediction of the Passion. Consequently, by restoring the first four words of today's Gospel passage, we are given the key for understanding the meaning of the Transfiguration. In other words, Mark is telling us that the Passion and glory are two sides of the same coin. By his Transfiguration, Jesus is giving a reassurance to the alarmed disciples. For all intents and purposes he is telling them something like this: do not panic, in the end everything will be all right. We need to be told over and over again that our human story, like the story of Jesus, will have a happy ending-like a fairy tale, only much better.

Author Elisabeth Elliot in her book *Keep a Quiet Heart*, conveys the same message: "What the caterpillar calls the end of the world" she writes, "the Creator calls a butterfly. As humanity we see only the imperfect, underside of God's tapestry of our lives. What we judge to be 'tragic - the most dreaded thing that could happen,' I expect we'll one day see as the awesome reason for the beauty and uniqueness of our life and our family." 365 Days with the Lord Fr Nil Guilemette SJ

Moreover, the insertion of the story of Jesus' transfiguration may be an invitation, as we enter more deeply into his Paschal Mystery, to reflect on his glorification, which occurs not only at the end - in his resurrection from the dead and ascension into heaven - but in the very midst of his suffering in the invincible power and radiant beauty of his self-sacrificing love unto death on the cross.
