Everything We Need to Know

Friends, our Gospel today is Jesus' best-known parable, and perhaps the greatest story ever told. It tells us practically everything we need to know about our relationship to God, if we but attend to the details carefully.

The younger son asks for his share of the estate and quickly squanders it in a faraway land - and so it always goes. We are the children of God; we have been given life, being, everything by him; we exist through him at every moment. What is represented here so vividly is the moment of sin, which means rupture or division.

So the son is forced to hire himself out so as to become a feeder of pigs. And no one gives him anything. Coming to his senses at last, he decides to break away and return to his father.

The father sees him from a long way off, and then, throwing respectability to the wind, he comes running out to meet him. The Bible is not the story of our quest for God, but of God's passionate, relentless quest for us. He puts a ring on his son's finger - the ring of marriage, symbolising the reestablishment of a right relationship between us and God.

What About Me?

We are very familiar with this Gospel story. The phrase "Prodigal Son" has even entered our common parlance; if someone has gone their own way but then returns to a group or a family we will sometimes say "the prodigal returns"... but there is always the outside chance that this is said more in scorn than in gratitude and concern!

Here in this story the father is on the lookout for his son who has wandered away from him; he is concerned for him; he loves him and he is always seeking his good. It is hard to know exactly what thoughts and worries were in the Father's heart, but many of us will know something of that "at a distance" care which we have to exercise for others.

The elder boy, the one who has always kept his head down and worked hard for his father, doing everything that was asked of him, is none too impressed when his brother comes back and is feted with such lavish care and attention. "What about me?" you can hear him say.

The situation in which Jesus tells this tale is an encounter amongst the Pharisees and Scribes, those who were well-versed in the Jewish Law and customs, who show a certain stand-offish attitude when they see that Jesus "welcomes sinners and eats with them".

Now there can be a tendency to think that all Pharisees and Scribes were bad people; not so. They had a love of God at the heart of what they were trying to do, but Jesus wants them to see another angle to their faithfulness - an angle of understanding of peoples' weaknesses and sin, and the fact that the Father – his Father, God – is always wanting to draw people back into a relationship of love and of care and of real and true family where they will be safe and welcomed. Yes, they will have learned lessons on the way, they will have made their mistakes and taken their wrong turns (which one of us hasn't?), but what will ultimately matter is that "your brother here was dead and has come to life; he was lost and is found". *Sunday Living Word* Majellan Family Media
