

Triumph to Triumph

Most people love a parade, noisily making the most of a chance to come together with others of like mind, to celebrate an event or highlight an issue. Holy Week begins with a parade. People get really involved throwing down their garments and rejoicing at all the mighty works they have witnessed through Jesus. Jesus rides triumphant through it all and encourages his followers to praise God with loud voice. Parades can bring out the best, and worst, in people. It is hard not to get caught up in the emotion of the moment and events that were supposed to be happy and peaceful sometimes deteriorate into chaos and violence. How the parade mood changed over the course of Holy Week! In the long Gospel of the Passion we see Jesus no longer triumphant but separated from his followers, insulted, struck, spat upon, and finally carrying his cross to crucifixion on Golgotha: 'He emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave even to accepting death on a cross.' What reaction do I have to these readings? Has my Lenten journey prepared me to be really present during this Holy Week?

His Ways

ur liturgy today makes me reflect on two processions of Jesus. First, the processional entrance of Jesus into the holy city of Jerusalem. While on several occasions Jesus forbade the crowd from proclaiming him as the Davidic King and Messiah, Jesus seems to have finally encouraged the crowd to shout: "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" This chant not only expresses the joy of the crowd; it identifies Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah.

In their excitement, though, the people never quite understand that Jesus' messianic identity is quite different from their dreams and expectations of a political and military restorer. Jesus enters astride a humble colt on which no one has ever ridden, not on a proud and powerful horse of a cavalier. And Jesus enjoys the procession. When the Jewish religious leaders ask him to silence the crowd, he declares that should the crowd grow silent, the very stones on the road would shout his praise.

The second procession is the way of the cross, described in the Gospel of the Passion. Here, Jesus is not carried in triumph. He is the one who carries a heavy cross. There are shouts that accompany him. This time, the shouts express anger. The crowd probably feels shortchanged. The people thought that Jesus would put up a fight with Pilate, with the puppet King Herod, with the oppressive Temple priests. They welcomed him as their hope, but his ways were not their way. So, they now shout: "Away with this man. Crucify him! Crucify him!" The people do not fully understand Jesus. Still, Jesus endures this cruel procession and humbles himself to death on the cross!

This procession is also accompanied by weeping. He tells the women of Jerusalem who mourn and lament for him: "Do not weep for me; weep instead for yourselves and for your children," and finally, from the Cross, to the Father, for all of us, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do."

His Will is Completed

The adversaries of Jesus pretend they are the directors of the final scenes of the drama of Jesus' passion and death. But the passion of Jesus unfolds according to the script of the scriptures. The scriptures reveal the will of God

Jesus began his journey to Jerusalem with a resolute mind to carry out, as always, the will of his Father. In the garden Jesus seems to have a brief dark night of the soul. But quickly he aligns himself with his Father's will.

On the cross in spite of a momentary sense of dereliction, Jesus dies entrusting himself into his Father's hand. As he breathes his last breaths, he declares, "It is consummated". It is completed.

The design, the will of the Father is fulfilled. So Jesus dies with a sense of fulfilment. His death was not a senseless tragedy. It was a victory, a salvific victory and a moment of glory. We believers can draw all strength and hope from it.
