


Easter Sunday Year C Cycle I 20 April 2025

My Friends

I'd like to go back a little to something that happened at Jesus' last supper with his disciples. Jesus tells the disciples that they are his friends. This is something profound: that God in the person of the Son of God has a bond of the deepest friendship with his companions. As he says, he loves them so much that he will give his life for them and, of course, not just for them but for all of us who love and follow him as well. And there's one thing so obvious that we might take it for granted; friends know each other by name.

In one of his talks Pope Francis said this about friendship. "Jesus tells us that for him we are precisely this, friends: people who are dear beyond all merit ... to whom he extends his hand and offers his Love, his Grace, his Word. With us, friends, he shares what is dearest to him, all that he has heard from the Father, even to the point of making himself fragile for us, of placing himself in our hands without defense or pretense, because he loves us. The Lord loves us. As a friend he wants our good and he wants us to share in his."

And so, when we receive him in Communion, although we may not hear the words, we can be sure he is saying, "My friend (and he'll call you by your name), "I love you".

The risen Jesus will show himself to his apostles and other followers. His new presence confirms to them everything he has done and taught. Their eyes will be opened to recognise him as the promised Savior, the fulfillment of the prophecies in the Old Testament.

Jesus' resurrection likewise confirms his divinity; the risen Christ is the principle and source of our future resurrection. He does not only rise to a glorious life for himself but he also shares this new life with all sons and daughters of the Father in the Holy Spirit. Our Easter Mass reminds us that "with the old order destroyed, a universe cast down is renewed, and integrity of life is restored to us in Christ" (Easter Preface IV).

Divine Mercy Feast

on the Sunday after Easter we celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy, where we may obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment, an extraordinary grace promised by Jesus. To obtain such grace we must go to Confession within 21 days before or after that Sunday, receive Holy Communion on the day, venerate the image of the Divine Mercy, and be merciful to others, through our actions, words and prayers.
