#### **Comprehend the Marvels**

Before this stubbornness born of love, the Lord grants the desire of Thomas. The confession of St Thomas, "My Lord and my God" is the greatest confession of one's faith. It is the confession of a great believer for whom there is no existence without the Lord; it is the confession of the one who is always willing and is completely available at the service of the Lord.

#### The Power of Belief

Thomas struggled to believe in Jesus, risen from the dead and the new life which he offered him. But Thomas' doubt was even stronger, he was stubborn, "Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my fingers in the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe". He made demands of Jesus and the other apostles. Thomas was arrogant. It must have been a struggle to stay with those who believed and were full of joy. He found himself on the margins.

God relentlessly pursues those who try to escape from him, never abandoning them, and protecting them unceasingly under the shade of his outstretched hand. The risen Jesus seeks Thomas out to speak to him and prove that he is risen from the dead. He appears to Thomas and invites him to do exactly what he has demanded. Thomas touches the wounds of the risen Jesus and says, "My Lord and my God". He believes.

We belong to the Body of Christ through Baptism. This is not an abstract reality but real, earthy, and fleshy. We meet Christ when we love our brothers and sisters as neighbours. Saint Francis of Assisi, leaving his rich life behind, despised lepers in general. But when he kissed one leper whom he met on the road to Assisi, his bitterness was changed to sweetness. Saint Francis recognised him as having the same dignity as one of God's children. We do not see the risen Christ directly like Thomas and the others to whom he appeared for forty days. Rather we meet the risen Christ through prayer, his Word, the sacraments, and other people. We walk by faith and not by sight. We rejoice in being those people of whom Jesus says, "Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe."

Actions speak louder than words. Many people find Christian outreach to the poor and the vulnerable, to the hungry and the needy, credible as a witness to the Gospel of Christ. This is the reason why Saint Francis of Assisi is loved by many people. Whilst not everyone is called to his radical way of life, we must each ask how we can live more simply and more generously towards others. Just as the apostles testified to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, so this parish community witnesses to the power of belief in Christ by touching the wounds of Christ in our own here and now.

#### Infinite Mercy

The Second Sunday of Easter Year B is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. The message from the readings of this day is about God's infinite mercy and love. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we learn about the early Christian community and how they devoted themselves to the teachings of the apostles, shared everything in common, and prayed together. In the second reading from the first letter of John, we are reminded that God is love, and that we should love one another as God loves us. The Gospel reading is from John, where Jesus appears to his disciples after his resurrection and offers them peace. He also gives them the power to forgive sins, telling them that whoever sins they forgive are forgiven, and whoever sins they retain are retained. This message teaches us that God's mercy and love are infinite, and that we should strive to live in harmony with one another and forgive each other's sins. Colleen Smith *Pastoral Associate*
