I Am There With You

or forty days after Jesus' resurrection from the dead, he appeared to his disciples, sometimes to one person, sometimes to a small group and on one occasion to more than 500 people, as St Paul reports. Then Jesus returned to the Father having completed his mission on earth. He ascended into heaven.

Jesus' return to the Father does not however mean that he is no longer with us. St Matthew wrote his Gospel to reassure Christians that Jesus is still with us. At the very beginning of his Gospel, the angel tells Joseph that the child will be called Emmanuel, a name which means 'God is with us'. And in the very last words of his Gospel, which we hear today, Jesus says, 'And know that I am with you always, yes, to the end of time.' And in the middle of the Gospel Jesus says, 'when two or three come together in my name, I am there with you' (Mt 18:20).

While Christ is with us in spirit, we are now the hands and feet and heart of Christ in our world. It is we who must go out and proclaim Christ to the ends of the earth. It is through us that people will meet the risen Christ.

Pastoral Works Appeal Next Weekend

ur Pastoral works are at the forefront of our community, serving those in need, helping to rebuild and renew families and parish communities and introducing our children in state schools to the wonder and beauty of our faith. The Diocese now has two Pastoral Works appeals each year – in May and November. These appeals mainly support two key Diocesan ministries which get little or no government funding: The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) – catechists taking the Gospel to approximately 14,000 state school children and Hospital Chaplaincy & Pastoral Care Program – practitioners visit more than 3,000 individual hospital patients each year. Pastoral Works Broken Bay also supports: St Lucy's School and St Edmond's College – serving students with disabilities, and The Ephpheta Centre – which provides support and advocacy for the deaf community. Funds raised during the appeal will go directly to these ministries. Profound Presence

In no way does Jesus' Ascension suggest that "God's in his heaven and all's right with the world." Nor do any other clichès fit: "Out of sight, out of mind," for example, or "Absence makes the heart grow fonder." Jesus isn't out of sight or out of mind, and it's not his absence but his profound presence that makes our hearts grow fonder.

Nor is the "three stories: theological geography true, in which heaven is "up," hell is "down," and we're at present in between. The scene of the ascension doesn't mean that Jesus "went up," but that the Lord has been taken into the Father's glory. Why the picture of "up" and "down"? Well, we, humans, have always given greater dignity to "up" than "down." Even in modern motion picture technique, the "good guys" are photographed from below, looking up, and the "bad guys" from up, looking down.

Jesus' ascension doesn't mean that he has departed from us. He has gone from our sight in order that he may more perfectly come to us. Jesus' ascension is to show us who we are, where we're going, and what we must do now. Both heaven and hell are all around us, and God's plan is that Jesus fill "all things in every way." God's plan for the world will, however, be brought about only bit by bit, and is in the hands of the Church. That means you and me. Because of Jesus' Passover-his death, resurrection, and ascension-we can no longer look at ourselves as mere earthlings: we must realise our heavenly dignity and destiny.

The end of Jesus' public life on earth is the beginning of the life of the Church: you and me. He had lived and died in an area less than 150 miles long, yet has come to be known throughout the world because his life was a life of service. We, too, have to realise that the only form of witness that most people will initially accept today is service. If we who believe in Jesus gave ourselves in service, the world would have been Christian a long time ago.
