### Nothing but the Truth

How many TV programmes, books, films and songs can you think of that have crime as their main focus? Take a moment to think... I'm guessing most of us got into double figures fairly quickly. Do you know which genres of novels sell the most books? Romance, and Crime. These two types of stories outsell all others by a significant amount. Our readings today also tell stories of love and crime.

A key element to many of these crime and legal stories is the taking of witness statements. Witnesses are asked to recount what they remember of what they saw and heard. They are asked a series of questions, "Can you describe the events as they happened?", "Can you identify the accused?", "Would you be willing to testify in court?" If a witness does testify in court, they are called by name to the stand and asked to swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth. Sometimes the entire case rests on the account of the witnesses.

The Apostles find themselves on trial before the Council of the High Priest. Their crime? Teaching in the name of Jesus. Their defense? "We must obey God." In Peter's witness statement, he tells of the coming of Jesus, Jesus' death and resurrection and the forgiveness of sins. Peter makes a witness statement of faith. He explicitly claims the name of "witness" for himself. Despite this witness testimony, the disciples are instructed not to speak in the name of Jesus. As we well know, or we would not be here today, the disciples disobeyed the court's ruling and chose to be obedient to God. *Sunday Living Word* Majellan Family Media
