Witness

What is the difference between an onlooker and a witness? An onlooker does just that: looks on. A witness looks on, too, except that what they have seen or heard leaves an impression, one which they may feel impelled to share. Not everyone, of course, is willing to be a witness. Witnesses run the risk of being laughed at, disbelieved, or closely interrogated. Where a crime has been committed, they may be afraid to disclose what they know. It is not uncommon for police to have to appeal for witnesses. Coming forward is the prelude to speaking out, and for many people, even that first step into the public arena is a step too far.

The death of Jesus was observed by huge crowds, and many witnessed his resurrection. Our Lord's body certainly had a story to tell! For a period of forty days, Jesus revealed himself alive on numerous occasions. People had long regarded him as a prophet: now they were beginning to perceive a truth more wondrous still... that in Jesus, they were seeing God! As he was lifted into heaven, they fell to their knees in worship. Speaking out about all this was dangerous. It was not the kind of news the authorities wanted broadcast. Even so, Jesus' friends did speak out, not just with courage but with joy! Most fearless were those to whom the ascending Lord now entrusted his mission. He promised them a share of that same powerful Spirit who had raised him from the dead and who was now lifting him to his rightful place at God's right hand.

As the Apostle John was later to write: "We saw for ourselves... and we testify!" They were witnessing, not just to the truth of external events, but to an inner reality: to the continuing life of Jesus within them. The Spirit was more than an injection of courage: God was changing them to be Jesus in their world.

Jubilee of Families, Children, Grandparents & the Elderly

Throughout this Year of Jubilee there are special celebrations highlighting aspects of Church life. This week the Jubilee celebrates the importance of the family unit, recognising the unique roles played by children and grandparents; and also honours the elderly members of our communities, some of whom are without family members of their own.

"You are fathers, mothers and children, grandparents, uncles and aunts. You are adults and children, young and old. Each of you brings a different experience of family, but all of you have one hope and prayer: that God will bless and keep your families and all the families of the world. All of you married couples, in building your family, made, with the help of Christ's grace, a courageous decision: not to use freedom for yourselves, but to love the persons that God has put at your side. Instead of living like little islands, you became "slaves of one another". That is how freedom is exercised in the family. There are no "planets" or "satellites", each travelling on its own orbit. The family is the place of encounter, of sharing, of going forth from ourselves in order to welcome others and stand beside them. The family is the first place where we learn to love. We must never forget that the family is the first place where we learn to love.

"Jesus tells the Apostles, 'Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you' (Mt 28:19-20). These words are also addressed to us today. They help us better understand that our vocation is to preserve our roots, to pass on the faith to the young, and to care for the little ones. Never forget this. It makes no difference how old you are, whether you still work or not, whether you are alone or have a family, whether you became a grandmother or grandfather at a young age or later, whether you are still independent or need assistance. Because there is no retirement age from the work of proclaiming the Gospel and handing down traditions to your grandchildren. You just need to set out and undertake something new.

"I want to tell you that you are needed in order to help build, in fraternity and social friendship, the world of tomorrow: the world in which we, together with our children and grandchildren, will live once the storm has subsided. All of us must take an active part in renewing and supporting our troubled societies. Among the pillars that support this new edifice, there are three that you, better than anyone else, can help to set up. Those three pillars are dreams, memory and prayer. The Lord's closeness will grant to all, even the frailest among us, the strength needed to embark on a new journey along the path of dreams, memory and prayer."
