## Wonder & Mystery

There is more to be seen than can ever be seen, more to be done than can ever be done. Today the Church gives us this feast to consider the fact that God is present and at work in more ways than we can see or fully grasp. This feast is not meant to tie us in theological knots; it is concerned more with the wonder of God's mysterious and loving presence. We are being asked to be inspired by and to imitate the unity of the Trinity, the love of the persons of the Trinity, the harmony that exists within the Trinity. The Trinity is a seamless unity of persons, a community of love. The Father is the one who loves, the Son is the one who is loved and the Spirit is the very act of loving. Therefore this reality, which we call mystery, teaches us three things: how to love, how to be loved and to be love. As we bless ourselves today, a simple action that many of us have been doing almost automatically since we were children, let us remember that we are signing ourselves in love and so let us live accordingly. We might not be able to help people understand the theological intricacies of this mystery, but we certainly can help them experience love.

### The Poor are our Masters

I believe it was Saint Vincent de Paul who used to say to those who wanted to join his congregation: "Never forget, my children, that the poor are our masters. That is why we should love them and serve them, with utter respect, and do what they bid us."

Do you not believe that it can happen, on the other hand, that we treat the poor like they are a garbage bag in which we throw everything we have no use for? Food we do not like or that is going bad we throw it there. Perishable goods past their expiration date, and which might harm us, go in the garbage bag: in other words, go to the poor. An article of clothing that is not in style anymore, that we do not want to wear again, goes to the poor.

This does not show any respect for the dignity of the poor; this is not to consider them our masters, like Saint Vincent de Paul taught his religious, but to consider them less than our equals.
