### We Believe

When we recite the Apostles' Creed, we declare that we believe in the "Communion of Saints". By this title, we are not just declaring a belief in all the canonised or proclaimed saints in heaven. We are stating a belief in the calling of all Christians, alive or dead, to see ourselves as linked to each other in our acceptance of Christ as the author of our salvation. A consequence of this is that we try to treat each other as we would treat Christ or, more importantly, as he treats us. This is not as easy as it seems, and it is no wonder we are at times happier to leave the call to holiness to the saints in heaven or to those who pursue the religious life. No such distinction is made in the Creed. We are all called to holiness because we are holy already, the beloved of Christ. St Paul tells us: "You are holy. Therefore, be holy".

The next question is inevitably: "What does it mean to be holy?" Does it mean being always in church or on our knees? That is not possible if we are holding down a job and looking after our family. Our holiness lies in how we live out the reality of our lives, how we treat each other, our honesty and integrity, our openness to loving and being loved. Prayer and our gathering as a community in church, especially to celebrate the Eucharist, help and support these aims, but the measure of our holiness lies in our daily challenges at home and abroad, "among the pots and pans", as St Teresa of Avila would say.

### Two Pillars

Simon Peter was first in the list of the Twelve Apostles. Along with James and John, he was witness to significant moments in the life of Jesus such as the Transfiguration (Matthew 17: 1), the raising up of the daughter of Jairus (Mark 5: 37), and the Agony in the Garden (Matthew 26: 37). In today's Gospel he is revealed as the rock on which Jesus will build his Church. Peter's primacy was recognised by the early Christian community and his martyrdom and burial in Rome helped to make the eternal city a place of great religious significance.

The apostle Paul brought the Good News to the nations, to the Gentile world. Many of the letters he wrote are included in the New Testament. As his life drew to a close, he took comfort in knowing that he had devoted his life to the spreading of the Gospel and that 'the crown of righteousness' awaited him. Like Peter, he suffered martyrdom. He was buried just outside the walls of Rome.

### You are the Christ

The Jews have long awaited the coming of the Messiah, and they imagine him to come in many different ways. Simon Peter is able to recognise Jesus, who stands before him and refers to himself as "Son of Man," to be the long- awaited Messiah. Jesus calls Peter "blessed." He also calls Peter son of Jonah. Peter has experienced spiritual transformation like the biblical figure in the Old Testament. Peter recognises Jesus as the Messiah not by human judgment but by enlightenment brought by the grace of God.

## First Saturday Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

Each first Saturday of the month Adoration is held following the 9am Mass, for one hour.

'In the Eucharist Christ gives back to the Father everything that has come from him. Thus there is brought about a profound mystery of justice on the part of the creature towards the Creator. Man needs to honour his Creator by offering to him, in an act of thanksgiving and praise, all that he has received. Man must never lose sight of this debt, which he alone, among all other earthly realities, is capable of acknowledging and paying back as the one creature made in God's own image and likeness. At the same time, given his creaturely limitations and sinful condition, man would be incapable of making this act of justice towards the Creator, had not Christ himself, the Son who is of one being with the Father and also true man, first given us the Eucharist.' – John Paul ll
