

### **Courage!**

Peter steps out of his boat into the troubled waters of life. Feeling the sudden force of the wind, he is afraid, experienced fisherman though he is. We can identify with Peter as we recall times of discouragement, disappointment, or frustration, when we knew the need to move forward and yet were hopelessly stuck. In the first reading, Elijah is overcome with fear and goes into hiding. He hears the voice of God telling him to go to Mt Horeb. There he will meet God. On the mountain he finds that God is not in the earthquake, or the fire, or the storm, but in a gentle breeze. When a breeze arrives, he covers his face for he knows God is present! Peter, in the storm's violence, hears Jesus' gentle reproach about his doubt and lack of faith. This same gentleness is in God's word that echoes in our hearts in difficult moments. Instead of listening to our panic, our fear and our doubts, let us tune in to the gentle, personal, encouraging word that God is speaking in our hearts: 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid!'

### Feast of the Assumption (Holy Day)

The Assumption of Mary is a reaffirmation of all that is good, gracious and hopeful. As Pius XII put it, Mary, "resplendent in glory in body and soul, reigns in heaven with her Son". Her presence in heaven, body and soul, is a great sign of God's goodness overcoming death and destruction.

All the great events of our redemption point to one important fact. When God saves us, God saves everything that makes us human. Our soul, our body, our emotions, our intelligence, are all redeemed and destined for eternal life with God and each other. It is precisely by becoming incarnate that Jesus begins his saving work in his mother's womb. It is by really dying on the cross that he defeats death. It is by really rising, body and soul from the tomb, that he prepares the way for our own resurrection.

Mary's Assumption into heaven is the pledge and image of what our own resurrection will be, the perfect reintegration of our body and soul, which were dissolved at our death. Mary's intercession for us before God helps along the way of salvation.

The Resurrection of Jesus, and Mary's Assumption, show to us God's great love and goodness, and fills us with joy and gladness.

#### **That Sinking Feeling**

ow do we find God in the storms and struggles of our lives, in the trials we encounter in trying to do his will?

God commands Elijah in today's First Reading to stand on the mountain and await His passing by. And in the Gospel, Jesus makes the disciples set out across the waters to meet him.

In each case, the Lord makes himself present amid frightening tumult - heavy winds and high waves, fire and earthquakes.

Elijah hides his face. Perhaps he remembers Moses, who met God on the same mountain, also amid fire, thunder, and smoke (see Deuteronomy 4:10–15; Exodus 19:17-19). God told Moses no one could see his face and live, and he sheltered Moses in the hollow of a rock, as he shelters Elijah in a cave (see Exodus 33:18–23).

The disciples, likewise, are too terrified to look on the face of God. Today's Gospel is a revelation of Jesus' divine identity. Only God treads across the crest of the sea (see Job 9:8) and rules the raging waters (see Psalm 89:9–10). And the words of assurance that Jesus speaks - "It is I" - are those God used to identify himself to Moses (see Exodus 3:14; Isaiah 43:10).

Even Peter is too overcome by fear to imitate his Lord. His fears, Jesus tells him, are a sign of his lack of faith. And so it often is with us. Our fears make us doubt, make it hard to see His glory dwelling in our midst.

Yet, we should know, as we sing in today's Psalm, that his salvation is near to those who hope in him. By faith we should know, as Paul asserts in today's Epistle, that we are heirs to the promises made to his children, Israel.

We must trust that he whispers to us in the trials of our lives - that he who has called us to walk along the way of his steps - saves us whenever we begin to sink.
