

Will Only a Few be Saved?

People have been asking this question from time immemorial and they still ask it today: "Lord, will only a few be saved?" Heaven, hell, salvation, damnation - who will be in and who will be out? We have remained fascinated with these questions for a long time.

How should we approach this issue? The doctrine concerning hell is a corollary of two more fundamental truths - namely, that God is love and that we are free. Love (willing the good of the other) is all that God is. He doesn't go in and out of love; he doesn't change his mind; he's not loving to some, and not to others. He is indeed like the sun that shines on the good and bad alike, in the words of Jesus. No act of ours can possibly make him stop loving us. In this regard, he is like the best of parents.

However, we are also free. We are not God's marionettes, and hence we can say yes or we can say no to his love. If we turn toward it, we open like a sunflower; if we turn from it, we get burned.

Notice how Jesus ultimately answers the question though. He says to them, "Strive to enter through the narrow door." In other words, stop bickering over how many or few other people will be saved and, in the words of St. Paul, "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling" (Phil 2:12).

Narrow Path Broad Heart

In our Gospel, Jesus is asked a question about salvation. In response, he challenges the assumptions of his hearers about who will have access to heaven. Their question focuses on numbers, yet Jesus' answer is more personal: we may be wondering who else is getting in, but a more fruitful question could be: "Am I so sure that I am getting in at all?"

Jesus then uses the image of someone seeking entry into a house only to find the door closed to them. The visitor protests, claiming a shared history with the householder, but to no effect: the door remains shut. The repeated answer from the householder inside, "I do not know where you come from", suggests that the caller who seeks entry does not share the same perspective as the owner.

Jesus does not leave it there. He goes on to say that the rejected person will witness people coming from all kinds of places and being allowed entry. You can almost feel the seething envy of the onlooker and their outrage at witnessing their sworn enemies from across the borders seemingly swanning in unchallenged. Perhaps Jesus implies the question: are you so sure you are bosom buddies with God?

The invitation this week is also to check our assumptions about others. The mercy of God, revealed in Jesus, is far wider than our narrow minds and vast intolerances. God's mercy could scandalise us unless we are willing to expand our horizons. We often draw up boundaries and make assumptions about other people's merits. Do our beliefs match those of Jesus? For each of us, treading the "narrow path" will depend on whether we know intimately, and thus recognise, the footprints of our Redeemer. Such a narrow path involves a broadening of the mind and heart. By closing the door of our hearts to others, wherever they may come from, whatever their situation, we could likewise find the door to the kingdom slammed in our faces. The narrow path of mercy is found and walked with a broadened heart and mind.

The story is told of two elderly priests, both nearing the end of their days, who made a pact. Whichever of them died first, he would return and tell the other what life beyond the grave was like. Eventually Fr Joe died and was buried. Some months later Fr Bill was sitting in his room. It was Saturday night; he was busy preparing his homily - or was it watching Match of the Day? In any event, he suddenly became aware of a presence: Fr Joe was standing there before him. "Joe," he gasped it's you. Tell me, what's it like in heaven?" "Well," replied Joe, "you'd be surprised who's there." There was a pause: "And you'd be surprised who isn't!" And with that he was gone.

We may discover that the response Fr Bill received from his friend had more than a grain of truth in it. Looking round the banqueting table of heaven, we may be surprised - by those who are there, and, perhaps, by those who are not. However, as we have been reminded today, our task it not to waste time on pointless speculation. What matters is that, avoiding complacency, we strive to live out our faith in our daily lives while putting all our trust in our great God whose love is strong and whose faithfulness endures for ever.
