He tells them a parable about a man trying as hard as he can to be noticed. But he gets noticed for all the wrong reasons! His egotistic games backfire dreadfully, as everyone sees him reduced to embarrassment.

So what's the solution? Stop playing the game. Take the lowest place on purpose. Opt out. Invite people to a party who have no capacity whatsoever to invite you in return: "Invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Noses Out of Joint

Seating arrangements at a table are notoriously difficult when planning weddings or special occasions of any kind. Noses must not be put out of joint, nor must warring parties be placed too close to one another. Jesus uses the etiquette of table arrangements to teach about the nature of the Kingdom of God. He turns the spotlight on those religious leaders who are preoccupied with their own self-importance and who are trying to catch him out. Jesus has observed how they pick the best seats for themselves and this indicates their interior priorities: to be seen, to be honoured, to be important. This is not the priority of the Kingdom of God.

Access to the feast in the Kingdom is gifted by God. Simply to be at this feast is honour enough. It is for God alone to make any further distinction between those who attend. Indeed, God declares that it is "the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind" that are the objects of his honour - those who know they are lowly, those who know they need saving, those who know they need God. These are the ones whom God calls higher. Those whom the world ignores and rejects, God favours and dignifies.

In our own lives we can often fall into the trap: giving honour to what the world honours rather than honouring what God honours. We have an opportunity really to think about how we set our priorities, and readjust them, so that we can better follow Christ. Let us ask ourselves some hard questions. Are we really aware of our need for God? Do we feel we are in need of saving or that we are basically OK and able to manage quite happily on our own? Who do I pay attention to in my daily life: those who are important and can "do something for me" or those who are powerless and require my help?

Here at this Eucharist we gather around the Lord's table. Each of us has our role to play in building the Kingdom of God. Here there is no place of honour except for the Lord Jesus who is our host and who nourishes us. Here we all stand and all of us are people in need of mercy and forgiveness, love and joy. We enter into communion with the Lord, not as a reward for good behaviour, but in order to be transformed and become more like Jesus Christ. He invites all to share in the fullness of God's love. It is in his power that we will confidently be able to invite others to join in building his Kingdom.

Social Justice Sunday Statement

The 2025–2026 ACBC Social Justice Statement, *Signs of Hope on the Edge: Serving People Living in Homelessness and Mental Ill-Health*, which was launched on 13 August, addresses the growing crisis of homelessness in Australia, with 273,600 people assisted by homelessness services in 2022–23, one-third of whom had a mental health issue. The statement highlights that rates of homelessness among those with mental ill-health have risen every year since 2011, driven largely by housing shortages and family and domestic violence. Many agencies are struggling to meet demand, leaving some families with young children and unaccompanied young people without emergency accommodation, while service gaps leave many with undiagnosed mental health conditions without support. The statement calls on us to follow Jesus' example by offering compassion, friendship, and hope, recognising that secure housing is essential for physical and mental well-being and that everyone is created in the image of God.
