

His Very Flesh & Blood

The Gospel reading is a clear, blunt teaching of Jesus about the bread from heaven. This bread is his very Flesh and Blood. To have spiritual life, one must eat this bread: his Flesh and Blood. In unmistakable language, Jesus declares that his Flesh is food and his Blood is drink. Lest this claim go unnoticed, he states it four times.

The phrase "flesh and blood" is rich in meaning. On a literal level, it is a common way of characterising a human being. When applied to Jesus, it is a proclamation of faith in the incarnation: he is indeed "flesh and blood." On another level, it calls to mind the sacrificial victim that is first slaughtered (flesh and blood) and then shared at a cultic meal (food and drink). Jesus is "flesh and blood" in this way as well, first as the sacrificial victim on the cross and then as Eucharistic food and drink.

The Christological interpretation of the manna has taken on a new meaning. The Flesh and Blood of Jesus have become the source of life for those who partake in it. In other words, eternal life comes from feeding on Jesus, not simply from believing in him as was stated in the previous two Sundays. Jesus goes a step further in his teaching on eternal life. He implies that it is not something that believers merely hope to enjoy in the future. Instead, those who share in the Eucharist already possess eternal life. What the future holds for them is the fullness of life that will be enjoyed after the general resurrection on the last day. Again the claims of Jesus are bold and hard sayings. We are told that his body, not merely his teaching, is the true bread that came down from heaven. We are told that only if we eat and drink what he offers will we have eternal life.

The Assumption of Mary into Heaven

hat do we Catholics mean when we express our conviction that, at the end of her earthly life, Mary was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory? Are we simply heaping praises upon Mary for her 'specialness'? Or is there something deeper at stake? In fact, like all Marian teachings, the Assumption speaks of the saving love of Christ that envelops our human lives. "For the Son of God became human, so that we might become God" is a saying of the Church Fathers (cf. *Catechism, 460*). Mary, the 'first disciple' of Jesus Christ, walks with and before us in our own path of Christian discipleship. Her singular participation in her Son's resurrection is an anticipation of our resurrection. Who Mary is, we are becoming. One day we, too, will live forever with God in heavenly glory. The Assumption is a compelling celebration of Christian hope, an affirmation of the human body, and deep-down encouragement in our earthly struggles.
