Listen to His Voice

Today's Responsorial Psalm is a hymn of praise introducing the people to God's presence. It served to remind the Jewish people as they came into the temple that they were entering a sacred place. When we gather for liturgy we too come into the presence of God in a special way. As Jesus tells us in today's Gospel. "Where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them."

Our awareness of God's presence fills us with a sense of humble awe prompting us to bow before him. We are also filled with joy and sing God's praises. Such songs and gestures have meaning only if we have a genuine desire to listen to his voice. If we come to the liturgy with hardened hearts, our songs and gestures are mere hypocritical show.

In the liturgy God speaks to us in many ways - in the Scripture readings, the prayers, the silences, the hymns, the ministers and the worshipping community, even in the baby crying a few pews away. 'Lord, what are you saying to me in this disturbance?' we might pray.

God speaks to us in other ways as well - in the brother or sister who courageously calls us back to him; in the prophets who stand sentry for our society and point out where we are going wrong, often at great personal cost; in the members of our community who seek to reconcile differences.

O that today we will listen to His voice.

Our Brothers Keeper

After humanity's first murder, when God asked Cain, "Where is Abel your brother?" Cain replied, "I do not know; am I my brother's keeper?"

Thereafter, centuries after centuries, no one seems to care about one's brother or sister to the point that thousands die every year in war and violence and we do very little about it. Who truly cares for the other?

As human beings and more so as Christians we are all responsible for the corporal life and soul of our brothers and sisters. We are exhorted to work hard for justice, unity and peace, and harmony among peoples and nations. The Gospel of today tells us that we are not merely called to give good example but sometimes we are also appointed as judges of our brethren as well. But we should do this with prudence and diligence after seeking good advice from the elders and the learned, and finally having recourse to the Church. Jesus recommends his followers to go to the Church because she possesses real authority and power to bind and to loose anything.

The passage also speaks to us about the immense and limitless fruits which come from unity shared among Jesus' disciples. "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst." The combined effort in the story is to bring reconciliation as a believing and united community

A Sign of One's Love

Evangelist Matthew, in his Gospel, pays special attention to the organisation and to the governance of the Church. The organisation of the Church includes a pastoral guideline to settle the issues that would emerge in the Christian communities.

One of the guidelines is fraternal correction and the way it should be done. Fraternal correction, first of all, presupposes knowledge - knowledge to identify the errors and to indicate the right path. Hence, it is necessary to make sure that the correction given is true, and not merely expressions of one's prejudices. Fraternal correction, secondly, should be a sign of one's love for others and not an occasion to accuse them and to assert one's authority over them; it is a delicate moment and never an occasion to show oneself as important, intelligent, and others as ignorant, inferior and incompetent. Thirdly, fraternal correction should be carried out considering human dignity, human frailty and the right to privacy. Therefore, it is necessary to respect the age, experience and good reputation of others. In fraternal correction, it is also important to keep in mind what we communicate and how we communicate.
