## A Compassionate Heart

One of the most celebrated film actors of our time is Keanu Reeves, best known for his role in the science-fiction movie *The Matrix*. It earned him so much money that he could live on it, he said, "for the next few centuries". He is also quoted as saying, "Money is the last thing I think about." That appears to be true. When one of the film crew got into financial difficulties, Reeves gave him twenty thousand dollars to clear his debts.

Reeves did much more than that. Feeling uneasy about his disproportionate share of box office earnings, he renegotiated his contractual right to a percentage of the sequel's profits. He was not pressing for more money, but for less, so that the visual effects team could receive a bigger share of the budget. After all, it was the creative work of stuntmen, make-up artists, costumiers, model-makers and computer specialists that had made the film such a success.

Keanu Reeves, a wealthy man with a compassionate heart and a sense of justice, is the very opposite of the kind of person we come across in today's Gospel. Jesus tells a parable about a rich man who consistently ignores someone in desperate need. Jesus was trying to shock religious leaders out of their complacency. The rich of his day, who felt assured of a place in heaven, would need to think again!

## Sense of Obligation

Many well-off people assumed that health and wealth were a sign of God's favour. It relieved them of any sense of obligation to help others. Jesus shattered their illusion, demonstrating how very dear to God's heart were the poor and suffering. That was good news for many, but it came with an insistence that they extend the same generosity of spirit towards others.

Living out the Christian message by loving other people as God loves us can be difficult. Nowhere was more challenging than the multi-faith city to which Paul's letter was addressed. Ephesus was home to the pagan cult of Artemis and to devotees of many other Greek and Egyptian deities, too, not to mention a sizeable Jewish population. From this combustible mix of faith and superstition emerged a fledgling community of Christian believers.

Timothy was their leader, but he was young and not convinced that he had what it takes to uphold Gospel truths in a hybrid culture. Paul's letter encourages him to keep fighting "the good fight of the faith". It was not the sort of fighting the feisty Ephesians were used to, for Paul was advising Timothy to be gentle and loving; not to assert himself, but to be himself; that is, a good person of unwavering personal integrity. Persuade people of the truth, Paul was saying, by practising what you preach. Win people to Jesus by being like Jesus.

## The Jubilee of Catechists

This weekend the Church celebrates the Jubilee of Catechists, a part of the Holy Jubilee 2025. Catechists play an important role within the life of the Church, but its one that can sometimes be hidden away. Through the work of The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) Broken Bay, Catechists are sent into public schools to provide Special Religious Education to young people. Catechists undertake a vital evangelising role, educating children and young people and forming them in the Catholic faith. For more and more people within our public school system have not heard of Jesus Christ or the Gospel, and so Catechists can often represent their first encounter with the Good News.

The Jubilee also celebrates those who run Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) within their parishes, helping to introduce adults to the life of the Church and the fullness of the Christian faith. For many Saints, being a Catechist has been an important part of their life and their sanctification. Saint Carlo Acutis, who was canonised earlier this month, served his parish as a Catechist, helping to teach people about the faith. Blessed Peter To Rot, who will be canonised in October, was also a Catechist in his village and helped to lead his parish during World War II when the Catholic missionaries were imprisoned by Imperial Japanese forces.

If you haven't considered being a Catechist, now may be the time to start thinking about it. Maybe you feel called to help bring adult converts into the Church? The Secular Franciscan Fraternity is becoming involved in helping local marginalised members of the community. Parishioners and Franciscans, Anna Sirolli, Lui Bruni and Jarmila Cadra are collecting donations of non-perishable items from parishioners and making them available for local distribution to the needy via the Benevolent Society Hub at The Entrance Community Centre. The Centre provides food relief four days a week, seeing an average of 120 people per week. The following items can be left in the baskets at the doors of the Church: tinned soups, tinned baked beans and spaghetti, long-life milk, juice poppers, noodles and noodle cups, tea and coffee, shampoo, conditioner and body wash.
