Happy Father's Day to All Our Dads!

This Father's Day we acknowledge the vital role of fathers, both earthly and heavenly, and seek God's blessings for all fathers. We recognise the example of faith and love fathers provide, and pray for strength, wisdom, and guidance for them. We pray also for fathers who have passed away, those longing to be fathers, and those struggling with fatherhood. The connection between earthly fathers and God the Father is unmistakable, and we ask the foster father of the child Jesus, St. Joseph, for his intercession on behalf of all fathers.

The Trap of Creature before Creator

It's one of the most challenging things Jesus ever says: "Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple."

There is the great spiritual principle that undergirds the entire Gospel: detachment. The heart of the spiritual life is to love God and then to love everything else for the sake of God. But we sinners, as St. Augustine said, fall into the trap of loving the creature and forgetting the Creator. That's when we get off the rails.

We treat something less than God as God, and trouble ensues. This is why Jesus tells his fair-weather fans that they have a very stark choice to make. Jesus must be loved first and last-and everything else in their lives has to find its meaning in relation to him.

In typical Semitic fashion, he makes this point through a stark exaggeration: "Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters ..." Well yes, hate them in the measure that they have become gods to you. For precisely in that measure they are dangerous.

At Stake

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives a stark warning to those who wish to follow him. Jesus had been drawing great crowds, he had been performing amazing miracles and his teaching must have been inspiring to hear. As Luke describes it, following Jesus must have been exciting, exhilarating, even fun.

Today's Reading comes just before Jesus and his followers set off for Jerusalem to celebrate Passover. Jesus knows that this journey will end in his death. His teaching shows him getting his followers ready for the changes they will encounter. Following Jesus will soon mean risking one's reputation and even one's life.

The language Jesus uses today sounds harsh. Can Jesus really be instructing us to hate our families? Jesus uses this extreme language to make a point. Sometimes in life we may find that we are presented with a choice: will we opt to put ourselves, our families, and our own desires and ambitions first? Or will we choose the potentially difficult and dangerous path of putting Jesus first, whatever challenges and hardships this will involve? Jesus warns his disciples that this choice is about to be presented to them and he tests their commitment.

Jesus makes clear that, in order to follow him, his followers are called to offer total commitment. Following Jesus through the events of his suffering and death isn't going to take mere friendship; it is going to take a determination that goes beyond common sense. As they witnessed Jesus going to his death on the cross, his followers might have been tempted to go home and get back to fishing or tax collecting. But in that dark and frightening time, did those disciples remember in their hearts how Jesus called them to follow him through his suffering: to take up their own crosses and choose the hard life of an apostle? The total commitment of those early followers of Jesus has provided the foundations for the message of Christ to travel across the centuries and across the globe.

We are fortunate that being a Christian here today means we will rarely encounter much worse than a sneer from those who disagree with our beliefs. Our challenge is to maintain the faithfulness that Jesus asks of us whatever situation we find ourselves in, even if we are not called to put it to the test in the same way that the apostles were. In the quiet of our hearts, can we say that if our lives were at stake would we still put Jesus first?
