

Be Opened

Jesus opens the ears of a deaf man. With the healing word in the native language of Jesus, Aramaic, "Ephphatha," Jesus heals the deaf man and restores his speech. He has just come back from a preaching stint in Lebanon, north of Galilee when the people ask him to perform a miracle, and Jesus obliges. This miracle is a sign that the Kingdom of God has come.

Notice that the deaf man does not go by himself to ask for healing. The people bring him to Jesus. This is an example of vicarious faith. One is healed because of the faith of other people. Their faith is not just for themselves, but also for others who need help.

The healing of the deaf-mute fulfills Isaiah's prophecy (First Reading) that lists as signs of the Lord's coming "the eyes of the blind opened, the ears of the deaf cleared, the lame leaping like stags, and the tongue of the dumb singing." More than 700 years before Christ, Isaiah declares that the Lord will pay attention to persons with disabilities.

In our celebrations, let us be careful not to drive away the poor from their seats to give way to the rich. Let us open our ears and lips for them. Let us use our beautiful language in their favour. *365 Days with the Lord* Fr Cielo Almazan OFM

A Fresh Perspective

I n today's Gospel Jesus touches a man's eyes and ears and lets him see and hear. Jesus uses sign language that the man understands, taking him aside and putting his fingers in his ears and his spittle on his tongue. Good teaching is about opening eyes, ears and minds - letting people see things differently, showing them a new perspective. So, what is Christ trying to teach us? Notice that Jesus never speaks in theological jargon. His preferred teaching style is the parable: stories about good Samaritans, lost sheep, lost sons and wedding feasts. Stories about things that never took place, but actually take place all the time - in every town and city, on every continent, on every day of human existence. Interestingly, Jesus rarely mentions God explicitly in the parables; they are not "other-worldly" stories but focus on the ordinary events of this world now. He knows such stories will stay long in the minds of those who hear them; he hopes that his listeners will make the connections, that the penny will drop, and they will begin to see life from a fresh perspective. The religious leaders around Jesus claimed to have all the answers. Jesus, on the other hand, often just asks questions, creating problems for his listeners to grapple with rather than spoon-feeding them solutions. 

Statue Purchases


