The process to become Catholic



Becoming Catholic may not look the same for everyone. While many people are welcomed into the Catholic Church with their baptism as a newborn baby, every year, hundreds of Australian young people and adults choose to become a part of the Catholic Church.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) (or RCIC for Children) is the process of Christian formation by which those who are seeking full communion with the Church. It is the way the Church helps an un-baptised person, or one from a different faith/tradition, to become an active member of the Catholic faith community. It consists of various stages by which adults are prepared to receive the sacraments of initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.
