Thank you for participating in the consultation phase of the Pastoral Discernment, North Shore project.

This Small Group Conversation Summary booklet has been developed to provide each small group with a space to record the small group listening and dialogue conversation.

In this, the consultation phase of the project, you are invited to give God thanks for the way in which the Spirit is at work in the life of the local Church, and to consider new possibilities for both its growth and the future of the region.

The practice of Conversation in the Spirit integrates active listening, intentional speaking, moments of silence, and respect for each participant's input. It can transform the way we listen to the Spirit moving in and through the group as we pray and discern together.

During the pastoral discernment listening and dialogue rounds you are invited to reflect, respond, and review the circumstances, opportunities, and challenges that may be considered to ensure that a sustainable and thriving ecclesial community exists for the North Shore region of the Diocese.

Journeying forward together requires us to discern, as a community, our context through connection, prayer, reflection, sharing with one another and seeking God's direction.

All are welcome to participate in the discernment consultation, and we invite the Holy Spirit to guide us as we begin this journey.


Each small group is invited to nominate a 'Table Facilitator' (see Appendix 1) and a 'Table Scribe' (see Appendix 2) who, once everyone has finished speaking, will work with the group to complete this summary report.

When completing your small group summary report;

- It is recommended that the group's response be captured in a short summary.
- You are asked to include 5 to 7 key points that capture the important parts of the discussion.
- Your response should reflect the diversity of views and opinions expressed, both positive and negative. It should be faithful to the people's voices and to whatever emerged from their reflection rather than a series of generalised or doctrinally correct statements.
- Views should not be excluded simply because they were expressed by a small minority of participants.
- Overall, the response should capture what the Holy Spirit has inspired the group to discern.
- Allow approximately 20 minutes to complete the report.

Once the report has been completed, submit your small group conversation summary response to your community Consultation Facilitator, who will collate and synthesise all responses that have been received from each small group, into a Community Summary Report.

Once the Community Summary Report is finalised, your community is invited to then submit a Pastoral Discernment Submission for Bishop Anthony's discernment and consideration.



APPENDIX 1

Role of the Table Facilitator

- Make everyone at the table feel welcome, explain the methodology of the approach being taken (Conversation in the Spirit), travel with the group and guide them, and allow people to be vulnerable and share their views and opinions.
- Invite everyone at the table to participate in the discussion.
- Keep an eye on time. Redirect if necessary to keep everyone on topic.
- People may choose not to say anything that's ok – your role as facilitator is to invite people to speak.
- Create the opportunity to listen to the Holy Spirit.
- Encourage dialogue and listening at the table.
- Create an environment of openness where people feel comfortable in sharing.
- Observe times of silence and prompt and remind those at your table of prayerful silence between rounds. Time for silence in between rounds allows time to listen to any interior movements in one's heart and spirit.
- Be mindful that this process is NOT a place for;
 - Debating, defending or arguing
 - Correcting others,
 - Feeling obliged to teach others, even if well-intended
 - Advancing an agenda
 - A search for the 'one right answer'

APPENDIX 2

Role of the Table Scribe

- During the three rounds of Conversation in the Spirit the Table Scribe takes notes of what everyone is saying to use as the collective notes of what was shared amongst the group.
- Following the three rounds of Conversation in the Spirit the Table Scribe works with the Table Facilitator, and all those at the table, to synthesise the fruits of the conversation and completes the SMALL GROUP CONVERSATION SUMMARY.
- At the conclusion of the three rounds of conversation, time will be allocated for writing the summary report during the session.
- The Table Scribe then submits the Small Group Conversation Summary to the Community Consultation Facilitator. The Consultation Facilitator will collate and synthesise the responses that have been received from all the small groups into a summary Parish/School/ Community report and prepare a Pastoral Discernment Submission for Bishop Anthony's discernment and consideration.
