

# A Prayer for the Plenary Council Journey







#### Introduction

In preparation for the Fifth Plenary Council of the Church in Australia, we as a community of the Church in Broken Bay have participated in a journey of listening, discussing and discerning what it means to belong to the wider Catholic Church in Australia at this moment in our history, and tried to discern what God is asking of us for his Church now and into the future<sup>[1]</sup>. This journey of evaluating the "joys and hopes, griefs and anxieties<sup>[2]</sup>" of our experience of the Church within a genuine spirit of discernment has allowed us to more clearly "listen to what the Spirit is saying."

As our Plenary Council delegates prepare to participate in the upcoming Assemblies representing the voice of Broken Bay, let us be united in prayer and ask the Holy Spirit to continue to reveal in them and in us how we can move forward as a Church that is missionary and evangelising; inclusive, participatory and synodal; prayerful and Eucharistic; humble, healing and merciful; a joyful, hope-filled and servant community; and open to conversion. As members of the Church, we offer the promise and the hope of the Good News of Jesus Christ, whom we proclaim to be the Way, the Truth and the Life (John 14:6). Only by walking in the footsteps of the Good Shepherd can we be faithful to this mission.<sup>[3]</sup>

This prayer guide, prepared by Evangelisation Broken Bay, hopes to encourage you, your parish, school and/or community to pray for the Plenary Council – the process, the people and the outcome. Through this prayer, may your relationship with Jesus also deepen as you seek to hear and respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit in order that you may proclaim with confidence; "I no longer live, for it is Christ who lives in me" (Gal2:20).

Mary Star of the Sea, an icon by Michael Galovic



#### Pour out your Holy Spirit, O Lord.


## Scripture Reflection (15 mins)

#### A reading from the Gospel of Matthew:

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

- Reflect for a few minutes on what you are hearing in the passage at this time.

For an outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Plenary Council Journey. **R**
