

Dear friends,

I am very pleased to present this week our **Parish Annual Report.** It is a wonderful tribute to the vitality of our parish community, demonstrating our continued growth. Thank you especially to Brendan Tertini who has worked as hard to produce such a remarkable publication. The Report is truly a tribute to us all! Thank you!

We have two special occasions this week. The Feast Day of St Carlo Acutis, 12 October, falls on Sunday this year. However, we will celebrate Mass in memory and honor of St Carlo on Monday 13 October at 12.30pm

Then, on **Wednesday 15 October at 6.30pm we will celebrate our annual Footprints Mass,** entrusting all those who have died in the womb through miscarriage or stillbirth into God's eternal embrace. Everyone is welcome to this very poignant commemoration.

It is now not too long before the month of **November during which we remember all those who have gone** before us. This year we will commemorate those who have died in a slightly different. We will have a choice to purchase a battery operated candle OR to bring along a framed photograph of the one we are remembering. The battery operated candle will avoid people having to look for their candle and to light the candle when they come to Mass, and all candles can be switched on and off remotely. If we wish to bring along a photo, the frame must be no bigger than A5 size, and we do so at our own risk. Next weekend we will publish the link to order the candles.

Towards the end of our bulletin, we will see a poster promoting a **special rally to be held outside NSW Parliament** in Macquarie Street on Wednesday, 22 October at 5.30pm to support the introduction of MLC John Ruddick's Bill to ban sex-selection abortion in the State We are encouraged to attend to send a clear message to Parliament that every baby deserves a chance at life – no matter their gender. October—The Month of the Rosary

Our Blessed Mother in her apparitions at Fatima in 1917 identified herself as The Lady of the Rosary. She appeared to three shepherd children Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco and repeatedly exhorted them to pray the rosary for world peace and the salvation of souls, to do penance and make sacrifices for the conversion of sinners. At that time the Great War was raging across Europe and she foretold that a greater war would follow during the reign of Pope Pius XI if mankind did not listen to her advice and repent. World War II as predicted by Our Lady has come and gone and it appears that mankind has not adhered to Our Lady's request to pray the rosary daily for peace.

According to pious tradition, the idea of the Rosary was given to Saint Dominic when the Virgin Mary appeared to him in an apparition in the year 1214. This Marian apparition is given the title of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Dominican priest and theologian Blessed Alan de la Roche promoted the practice of the Rosary by establishing the "fifteen rosary promises" and founding several rosary confraternities.

The rosary is the favorite prayer of heaven and earth. No other prayer has been recommended by Our Lady in her visitations from heaven to earth like the rosary. No other prayer has been so frequently praised, commended and even commanded by the Popes, or enriched by them with such great indulgences as the rosary.

Devotion to the Rosary is one of the most distinguishable features of popular Catholic spirituality. The Rosary inspires us to meditate on the mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary. Meditation is an important part of our lives as Catholics. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, meditation "engages thought, imagination, emotion and desire. This mobilization of faculties is necessary in order to deepen our convictions of faith, prompt the conversion of our heart and strengthen our will to follow Christ." It makes sense to recommend the rosary especially given that Our Lady herself has asked us to pray it assuring us, that said with faith, it will bring us spiritual benefits, be an effective instrument in changing hearts and help to promote peace in our troubled world.

Rosary Events in our Church

We have the Marian Movement of Priests (MMP) Rosary (also known as the Cenacle) every Monday at 11.45 am (MMP Cenacle)

Daily rosary is prayed every Tuesday to Saturday following the 9 am Mass and after the 12.30 pm Mass every Monday to Friday.

We have a Parish Online Rosary on some of Our Lady's major feast days, usually at 8 pm. The next one will be on Tuesday 7 October at 8 pm (Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, Link: https://us02web.zoom.us/j/82321899320 or Meeting ID: 823 2189 9320) and Monday 8 December (Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Zoom details will follow). Please feel free to join us.

"One Million Children Praying the Rosary" (Pray & Play) will be held in the church on 7 October at 2 pm. Parents are invited to bring their children to be part of this event. See details on flyer in the bulletin.

Please join us for a **Public Rosary in the forecourt** of the church on Saturday 11 October at 11 am (see separate notice). This public rosary is an international campaign to pray the rosary together in commemoration of the last apparition of Our Lady (October 13, 1917) at Fatima. It is a great opportunity for prayer groups and communities to join together in public prayer.

A group of young people in our parish are responsible for organising the Five First Saturdays rosary devotion which is held every first Saturday of the month either in the forecourt or in the church (depending on the weather). This is in compliance with the request of Our Lady in 1925 when she appeared to Sr Lucia, one of the visionaries at Fatima in 1917. 

A total sum of \$8,092.80 was raised and donated to the Pastoral Works of Broken Bay. This was a significant team effort, and we would like to thank all our contributors.

This study group is open to anyone interested in joining us for our fortnightly reading, discussion, and reflection on the Gospel for the coming Mass. LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

2 Kings 5:14-17

A reading from the second book of the Kings Naaman returned to Elisha, the prophet, and acknowledged the Lord.

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became dean once more like the flesh of a little child.

Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.' Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

THE CRY OF THE ABANDONED

In this very familiar Gospel story, often titled 'the healing of the ten lepers', Jesus is in an unholy and impure setting. He is travelling, as Luke notes, between the borders of Samaria and Galilee. In technical terms, this is a 'liminal' place. It is 'on the edge' between an area familiar to Jesus (Galilee) and one that is unfamiliar and even potentially dangerous (Samaria).

He enters a village. Jesus' generic placement (it is 'a' village, not a definitively named location) allows Luke's audience to see themselves in this situation. It is us as we move through life not knowing what awaits us. Jesus is approached by ten contaminating and impure characters. They are called 'lepers'; their leprosy is not our traditional Hansen's disease but a contagious skin condition. It has the potential to disrupt and contaminate the community.

As they distance themselves from Jesus they appeal: "Jesus, Master, have pity on us.'The Greek literally reads, '... have mercy on us'. This is the cry of the abandoned who seek God's comforting presence. It is also our cry in desperate times. Jesus tells the ten to go to the priests, the officials that can declare their healed cleanliness. Only one returns to thank God's healing work revealed in Jesus. It is the unexpected one, the 'foreigner' that recognises God's action through Jesus, a theme that echoes throughout Luke. Today's Gospel invites us to look for God's actions in the most surprising places among God's most unexpected people. These become the sources of eucharistic thanksgiving.

An Appeal from Mariza Sollano (a Filipino parishioner) whose hometown in Cebu was affected by the recent earthquakes.

Dear friends,

My hometown of Bogo City was the epicentre of the 6.9 magnitude earthquake that hit the Philippines on 30 Sept. To date, the aftershocks are relentless and there had been over 8,000 recorded already with many over 5.0 magnitude.

I have been coordinating with my friends from uni to support activities on the ground such as the supply of water filters and aid packages in various towns. The road to rehabilitation is a long one. In fact I refused to see what is left of our family home. I am fundraising to support the earthquake survivors.

On 15 November, we are holding a fundraising dinner at Harrington Hall at Chatswood Parish. It will be an all-Cebuano fare.

We are home cooks who cook from the heart. We will treat you to a culinary journey of foods from our childhood: salads from the land and from the sea. Mains that features tomato-based sour fish soup from our island, 3-hr slow cooked pork, goat casserole with meat that in rich sauce and meat that falls off the bone, vegetable dishes enriched with the creaminess of coconuts. Desserts that will remind you of Mexico as you relish on "pintos" — a sweet young corn dessert akin to tamales. Enjoy the mochi-like peanut-filled glutinous dumplings, and our sticky rice, mango and hot chocolate made of 100% cacao drink offering as to mention a few.
