## FROM FR JOEY

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

While Father David is away on his vacation, Fr. Marek and I will provide you with parish updates and some personal thoughts.

The funeral of our beloved Anthony Mustaca was held last Tuesday. His children delivered beautiful and moving eulogies and the church was packed with his family, relatives, and friends. We continue to pray for the eternal repose of Anthony's soul. We also pray for his wife Heather, his daughters, his sons-in-law, and the rest of the family as they mourn his passing. May God's peace and presence be their consolation in this time of loss.

Last Sunday at the 10:30am Mass, we continued to have children

receiving their first Holy Communion. Congratulations to all of them, and many thanks to their parents, at such a momentous occasion in their faith life.

After the 9:30am Mass, many of our children and their parents attended our morning tea at the OLD Primary School playground, playing games and enjoying the good weather. Seeing the kids just having fun reminded me of the importance of families and their children to our parish, and the life and vitality they bring.

With the countless ministerial demands in the parish, we often miss the importance of the family and the need for a ministry for families. John Paul II said that "the future of humanity passes by way of the family" (Familiaris Consortio,86). This means that the future of humanity depends on the formation of children in their families. If we do not give good formation to our children, then we cannot expect a good future for them.

In terms of our faith, the family is considered to be the "domestic church" (Lumen Gentium, 11). Like the bigger church, families (and particularly parents) are responsible for educating and forming their children in the faith. As our Catechism states: "Parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. They bear witness to this responsibility first by creating a home where tenderness, forgiveness, respect, fidelity, and disinterested service are the rule. The home is well suited for education in the virtues (2223). Education in the faith by the parents should begin in the child's earliest years. This already happens when family members help one another to grow in faith by the witness of a Christian life in keeping with the Gospel. Family catechesis precedes, accompanies, and enriches other forms of instruction in the faith. Parents have the mission of teaching their children to pray and to discover their vocation as children of God (2226).

They say that faith is both taught and caught. This means that even though our children are taught about the faith in their Catechism class, if within the family the faith is not practiced, then there is a strong possibility that when they grow older, our children will lose the faith because they never caught it while growing up. Our parish is so blessed that we have children's liturgy at our 9:00am Mass. By coming to Sunday Mass with their parents, children are not only being taught about the Catholic faith, but they also catch the practice of the Catholic faith.



One of the important points made in our Catechism with regards to our children is their education in the virtues. St Gregory of Nyssa says that "the goal of a virtuous life is to be like God." To imitate our Lord then is to develop a virtuous life and it is best to teach our children the virtues from a young age.

We all know that family life is so busy these days, but we can never reap the fruits if we do not invest in the very thing that we deem important for us. We might invest our children's times in sports, music, arts and other skills, but let us not forget to also invest in that which will be with them always as they navigate through the many challenges in life, and that is faith in God.

Oftentimes I ask myself, 'What should we do to reach out and evangelise our children?' Our parish might have innumerable programs for the faith formation of our children, but if their parents do not bring them to participate in these programs, then they will never learn and catch the faith. Both parish and parents have the responsibility to evangelise our children, and both need each other. Our children deserve the best, so let us give them nothing less than the best!

Mend our hearts, from shards restore, Guide us to love's open door. In sorrow's soil, let strength take root, In pain's ashes, let hope bear fruit.


With each dawn, new mercies show, In each dusk, peace's river flow. Transform our tears into a sea, Where sorrow births serenity.

#### THIS WEEK'S BULLETIN COVER PICTURE: BLESSED MIGUEL PRO

Blessed Miguel Pro, a Mexican Jesuit priest who was martyred during the Cristero War, stands as a beacon of courage and faith for all Catholics. Despite the persecution of the Church in Mexico, he continued to serve his flock, conducting Mass in secret and offering spiritual guidance.

When captured, he refused to denounce his faith. Before his execution, he forgave his executioners and held his arms out in the form of a cross, crying out, "Viva Cristo Rey!" ("Long live Christ the King!"). His courage in the face of death is a reminder that while the body may be killed, the spirit remains invincible when fortified by faith. His life challenges Catholics to fear not those who can kill the body, but to fear instead the loss of conviction and faith.

Miguel Pro teaches us that true courage comes from a heart anchored in faith, reminding us of Jesus' words in this Sunday's Gospel according to Matthew: "And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell." The brave life and death of Blessed Miguel Pro inspires us to live boldly for our faith, irrespective of the cost.

## GOSPEL REFLECTION

The second discourse of Matthew's Gospel occupies chapter 10. We hear it proclaimed on this Sunday and the following. In Matthew's version, the mission of the Twelve is only to the people of Israel (10:5-16) and they are to preach the nearness of kingdom not only in word but in action, by healing the sick, raising the dead, cleansing lepers, and casting out demons. Jesus warns them of the opposition they would encounter (10:17-25), before moving to today's section, which speaks of the fearlessness the apostles are to need in the face of such opposition.

'Do not be afraid', is the exhortation of Jesus to his apostles and to us. We live in a church seemingly enmeshed in endless scandal; the good news of God's love seems imprisoned in the darkness of unending failure among those of us who seek to serve God's people through leadership and ministry. Our society has lost trust in the institutional church because of such inexcusable evil. The words of Jesus today promise that even such tragedy cannot overpower the message, even though it certainly seems that way at the moment. Jesus promises that God watches over those whom the rest of the world forgets, the sparrows among us. It does seem hard to believe in a God who cares for the small and insignificant when many of the most vulnerable among us suffer at our hands instead of being cherished.

So these words of Jesus are ever more pressing as things look darkest. More than ever, Jesus' call to bear witness to him needs to be taken up by every baptised person. The Spirit has been given to us and it is the Spirit who shines in the darkness, it is the Spirit who makes Jesus come to life within us, it is the Spirit who gives us strength in our weakness. We bear witness to him by the faithfulness we show to his gospel, by the life-affirming care we lavish upon the downtrodden and destitute, the helpless and the homeless, the vulnerable and the needy.

Augustine of Hippo advises his community: 'Let us fear, in order not to fear; that is, let us fear wisely, in order not to fear groundlessly' (Sermo 65). We would be wise to fear denying God by a life of sin that does not bear witness to the life and love promised us. We would be wise to fear complacency, which blinds us to the demands of constant reform and conversion.

While today's gospel calls us to action, it also calls us to give thanks. We must be thankful for those who do witness to what is true and right, even if their fidelity is overshadowed by the failings of others. We must be thankful that fear is not the final word, that failure will not extinguish the good news of God's love, no matter how much that flickering light of hope seems to be about to go out. We must be thankful that the grace of God, poured into our hearts through the Spirit who makes our gifts of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ given up for our nourishment, is about to be given once again to us in this sacred meal we share.


## OUR WEEK IN PICS

# THE NATIVITITY OF ST JOHN



This Saturday the 24th of June the Church celebrates the birth of St John the Baptist - one of only three birthdays that is recognised in the liturgical calendar, with the other two being that of Mary and Jesus.

St. John's birth marks the advent of a prophet who prepared the way for Jesus Christ. John was not just a herald of the divine message; his birth symbolized hope and renewal, a light in the darkness, as his aged parents, Elizabeth and Zechariah, bore a him against all odds.

St John's birth reminds us of the very real power of having faith in the face of impossibility, and is an encouragement to persist in our pursuits despite the obstacles that stand in our path because God will always be there.

St John's birth also serves as a reminder of the internal birth of awareness and consciousness that we should all have as people of God. Like John, we are all called to prepare the way, in our hearts and minds, for the emergence of Truth and Love. In our lives, we encounter situations that invite us to become 'John the Baptists' – to be beacons of hope, heralds of change, and catalysts for transformation.

Who knew a baby could symbolise so much for us? God did, and I think we do too when we look in to the eyes of children and see the beauty of their innocence and the promise of hope their lives bring.

## VINNIES CHATSWOOD WINTER APPEAL JULY 1-2



The St Vincent de Paul 2023 Chatswood Winter Appeal will be held next weekend on 1st to 2nd July 2023. This local Appeal is part of the Statewide Appeal which began in May and will last until the end of August.

The main work of the St Vincent de Paul Chatswood Conference is to provide support and assistance for people in need in our local area. The Chatswood Conference has so far received more than 50 requests for assistance; and has expended over \$8,000 in meeting the emergency needs of the people in our local community.

The supports we have provided included food, medical, pharmaceutical, whitegoods, furniture, rental assistance, transport and clothing.

Our parish contains a large government housing population from which comes most of the calls for assistance. Many of those seeking for support are people from disadvantage backgrounds, single parent family, people with mental health issues and those lacking life skills to handle problems.

Up until last year Appeals, your generous support has allowed us to cover all the costs in providing supports to people in need in our area without the need to seek supplement funds from other areas of the society.

If you wish to make a donation, envelopes will be available around the church and may be put on the collection plates. Provision is made in the envelopes for cash or credit card donations.

## **VINNIES MAY REPORT**

During May the Chatswood Conference of the St Vincent de Paul received 11 requests for help; 7 of these were from people previously unknown to the Conference.

The most urgent was from a well educated asylum seeker, ineligible for Centre Link Benefits, who had lost his job, fallen behind in rent and was not eating regularly.We assisted with rent and provided funds for food and job seeking.

Two others were Job Seekers whose benefits had been suspended; we helped with food to cover the period till pensions were restored.

Two others had to change their accommodation; we helped these with food, appliances, clothing and bedding.

The other requests involved food, medical treatment and transport. Over \$1800 of assistance was given.



## CHOIR CORNER



**Titus Grenyer** Director of Music As we look to enhance the worship in our parish, the time has come to formally establish the Parish Choir. 
## FLORAL ARRANGEMENT DONATIONS






