Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

Luke's Gospel is striking in that it is the only Gospel that contains two accounts of Jesus's sending the disciples on mission (see 9:2 and 10:1). Jesus is very clear in what the disciples should take with them on mission: "Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals" (10:4). Travel during Jesus's time was dangerous, especially because of robbers on the road. If the disciples carry nothing of value, they won't attract the attention of robbers and will thus have safer travels. Upon arriving in a town or village, the disciples look for local people who will extend hospitality to them. Jesus instructs the disciples to depend on the hospitality of the first person who offers it and to stay in that person's home. Hospitality is most likely extended by the village or town elder. In addition to giving the stranger a place to sleep and food to eat, the person extending hospitality also provides protection for the stranger. Once the stranger has gained the approval of the town elder, then all in the village or town welcome and respect him or her. That is the context for Jesus's statement, "I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves" (10:3). Jesus also advises his disciples to shake the dust from their feet if they come to a town or village where they are not welcome. This gesture publicly acknowledges the denial of hospitality to the disciples. However, Jesus goes on to encourage the disciples to use even an occasion of being rejected and denied hospitality to proclaim the Good News that the Kingdom of God is coming—in fact, is very near.

When the disciples return, there is great rejoicing for what they accomplished. Jesus reminds the disciples that he has given them authority over destructive forces and that nothing will hurt them. Then Jesus closes with these great words of wisdom: "Do not rejoice at this, that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven" (10:20). Jesus is reminding the disciples that the prize is not human glory consisting of recognition and honor but rather heavenly glory obtained by following Jesus through his death and Resurrection—following Jesus to Jerusalem and Calvary. This is what true freedom is about—trusting wholly in Jesus both in the good times and in the challenging times.

From our Parish Pastoral and Missionary Council

The Parish Pastoral and Missionary Council met on Tuesday 28th June in the Magnificat Meeting Room. We continue to study and follow the guidance from the Synod of bishops on For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission. (Vademecum for the Synod on Synodality, 07.09.2021). Specifically, on Attitudes for Participating in the Synodal Process (section 2.3). This includes making time for sharing, listening, dialogue, openness, being inclusive, having an open mind, and journeying together. Following an inspired suggestion from one of our parishioners, we have updated the name of our parish renewal programme to 'Being Church in the City, **We** Journey Together', which shifts our attention to the action of journeying.

Fr David updated us on news from around the parish:

- Conversation Circles in May were well received, and allowed a chance to discuss ideas that arise from this renewal programme. Further conversations will be scheduled again in October.
- Developments within and surrounding the precinct including Chase Quarter and potential opportunities for our parish.
- Creation of the Giving Committee remit. This will be a subcommittee of the Parish Finance Committee, to imbue a culture of stewardship and giving as part of discipleship, and provide strategies to maximise participation and funding.

Brendan provided an update on Church in the City: We Journey Together:

- 84 Dreams have been submitted so far and are now being analysed.
- National Church Life Survey summary results from earlier this year have been received, providing us insights into the makeup of our parish.
- 384 parishioners and families completed a Census card. The census is a very important way by which we can ensure we are able to keep in contact with you. The initial results of the Census are featured in this bulletin.
- Next steps are to build a task force to start actioning and coordinating the ideas founded in the dream responses.

Many parishioners, through the Census cards, have indicated their desire to become more involved and active in the parish. In the coming months, we will get in contact with you to let you know how to get involved.



Listening to the Ear of the Heart

During June, our parish provided a 3-episode series in Listening to the Ear of the Heart led by Elizabeth Lee. Elizabeth has degrees in science, education and theology and currently provides pastoral care to the homeless. Prior to that, she had what she describes as 'many life-giving years' as a prison chaplain. Her course in deep listening was designed specifically for our Community Action members who aim to work with the homeless but was open to all parishioners. Between 10 and 20 people took advantage of the opportunity and learned how one's own posture and eye contact, the environment and one's personal attitude and prejudices affect how well we 'hear' another person, whether a stranger or a loved one. We practised listening without speaking for up to 5 minutes with an observer to give us feedback on the effectiveness of our listening. We learned to monitor our human rush to judge what we heard and gained a greater understanding of how different we all are and how our experiences, our perspective and our needs shape the beliefs and prejudices we all have. In the final session we also learned how to keep healthy boundaries as a deep listener and how to care for ourselves. We found the training very helpful. Fr David has kindly agreed to offer another course by Elizabeth next year during Lent. This will be on Restoring Relationships and again will be open to all.



Last Monday, our Catechists had their first retreat with Fr Marek.

The ministry will set a date as part of the formation of our catechists here in Our Lady of Dolours.

The idea of being together as a group, having benefited with the insights that each one shared, the acknowledgement of the catechists and the work that they do spreading the word of God each week in state schools are all present in this fruitful and beautiful retreat.




For our Group Leaders and People using our Meeting Rooms


