From Fr David

Dear friends,

I am very humbled by our response to our annual Pastoral Works Fund Appeal. This is the appeal that our diocese undertakes primarily for the support of our Catholic children in public schools and our parish catechists who take our Faith to them each week. We have over 700 children in our five public primary schools and at Chatswood High. Nearly fifty of our parishioners volunteer to teach Special Religious Education to them. It is a most significant ministry. This year we have indeed reached our parish 'quota' for the fund which is **\$73,693. Due to your generosity we have met this target and already exceeded it by \$2,400.** This is altogether exceptional and I am deeply grateful. **THANKYOU!** Most importantly, I do so on behalf of the hundreds of children to whom we reach out to each week.

This week we welcome 55 children receiving the Eucharist for the first time, thereby completing their Sacraments of initiation and becoming full members of our Catholic Family. We congratulate them and support them with our prayer and our blessings. A very special thank you to Angela Hague and Mona Saouma and the many parent leaders who coordinated and accompanied the program of preparation for our children.

Bishop Anthony has written a letter to us this week on the Eucharist, in anticipation of the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) next Sunday. Copies of the letter are available at the entrance of the church.

Thank you to the parish team and our many volunteers who maintained our church and office over the last week whilst our clergy were at their annual diocesan clergy conference. Unfortunately, Fr Anselm could not join us given a bad flu but he is well again now. It was a gracious time of fraternity and nourishment from the pastoral wisdom of Fr Chris Ryan MGL. A special thank you to Elizabeth Jung who opened and closed the church whilst we were away.

Thank you, too, to those who have shared their thoughts on our proposed external sculpture of Our Lady of Sorrows. These are invaluable. Our artist, Linda Karfeld invites such engagement and this will be most important as an initial concept moves to something more developed. Please see page 8 of our bulletin for more details about this.

Just to share again in the event that it was missed last week: Bishop Anthony had given our parish permission to extend the presbytery on 100 Archer Street. The concept and design of the extension had been circulated through the parish during 2024. Regrettably, though there had been extensive consultation with Willoughby Council personnel during 2024 such as to submit the Development Application with confidence, the outcome has been a **recent notification by Council of a rejection of the proposal**, primarily given apparent heritage constraints of the corner block occupied by the residence. This is very disappointing given the extent of collaboration engaged with the Council in the preliminary stages of design. However, we now need to consider our options. These range from various appeals, through to a redesign of the extension, through to more lateral possibilities. Our Parish Finance Committee is now working with our diocesan property personnel and with our project manager, Project Strategies Australia about what our most constructive options might be. Once these have been determined, we will certainly share with the parish community. In the meantime, disappointedly, it is unlikely that there will be any movement on construction in the coming year.

Be sure not to forget our farewell of Deacon Kevin with a Mass at 6.30pm and Supper on this Wednesday 18 June.

Lastly do keep Tuesday 1 July at 7.00pm free to meet the engineers who are assisting us with the future upgrade to our church's possibilities.

The following is the step-by-step guideline for the *Broken Bay Pilgrim Passports*

1. Jubilee Passports can be stamped at each Shrine and the Cathedral to acknowledge visit and time of prayer within. A special downloadable [Broken Bay Jubilee Passport for Kids](#) for children to use when visiting the Shrines with their families/caregivers.
2. Once all three Shrines and Cathedral, with respective stamps, have been visited a Pilgrim's passport is "complete".
3. Pilgrims then have their passports verified at their own Parish office.
4. Each Parish will notify Mission Broken Bay with the names of those pilgrims who have completed their passports so that they may receive a special commemorative certificate signed by Bishop Anthony. This is a wonderful opportunity to highlight the Jubilee by presenting these certificates at the end of a Sunday Mass.

A live Tally on the www.bbjubilee.com.au website will add a further joyful essence, noting how many pilgrims have completed the Jubilee Shrines of Hope Pilgrimage and which parishes they are from.

Our Animating our Future Ministry Circle

Dear friends,

A great word of thanks to those who shared their thoughts on our proposed outdoor sculpture. As I mentioned this is simply an initial concept and the artist Linda Klarfeld is very keen to work with us in bring something to life. Passing on the comments to Linda, she wrote back:

It is a good sign that people are already responding to the concept because in my experience that will give them a sense of ownership. I personally like the idea of co-creation, so I am happy to take any feedback on board.

Michaelangelo's Pieta is arguably one of the most famous sculptures in the world, the Notre Dame Pieta is lesser known but it is still very powerful. Michelangelo's Pietà is introspective and idealized, aiming to inspire quiet contemplation. Mary is portrayed as a serene youthful mother, with a calm expression, emphasizing her divine grace rather than human grief. Jesus appears peaceful and almost asleep rather than bloodied or broken. Mary is a more passive figure showing controlled sorrow; the focus is on spiritual acceptance, not dramatic pain.

The Pietà de Notre-Dame is expressive and dramatic, designed for public awe and liturgical resonance. More dynamic and emotional than Michelangelo's version. Mary's deep sorrow is more openly expressed; Mary's grief is visible in gesture and facial expression. Jesus appears to be sliding from her lap, suggesting instability and emotional urgency. Mary is a more active figure.

Both are masterpieces of their time, reflecting differing artistic priorities: one internal and Renaissance, the other external and Baroque. Because they are on such different ends of the spectrum then it will be difficult to combine the two. Competing with Michaelangelo and the fame of his Pieta is virtually impossible so it might be a good thing that we are going to do something different. But if you want me to change direction, I can still do that, so it is entirely your decision.

I didn't even notice that I had portrayed Jesus as a modern man, this must have been subconscious, it is a valid point and I am happy to include the long hair and the crown of thorns.

Please thank those taking the time to give her feedback. The creation process will allow us to explore all these ideas and I look forward to starting the sculpture.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH

We continue on this Feast Day to enjoy the Gospel of John and Jesus' continuing teaching on the Spirit, whose presence is subtly present in the first reading's focus on Wisdom and explicit in Paul's Letter to the Romans. Last week, Jesus offered his fearful disciples the gift of peace. It is the fruit of his Spirit. Today, as he is about to physically leave them, in what feels like a final moment of testimony, Jesus reminds them about the other fruit of his Spirit: the Spirit that will lead them 'to the complete truth', will offer wisdom—a link with the first reading from Proverbs 8—and prepare them for their future.

Jesus accentuates the intimacy which the Spirit has with him. This intimacy, through the Spirit, Jesus shares with his disciples in words that prepare them for his departure. The Gospel writer, looking back from the late first century CE when the Gospel was coming into its final form, had the advantage of hindsight. The evangelist could see how intimacy with Jesus through the gift of his Spirit would sustain them into a future that is essentially unknown and unpredictable.

This Feast of the Holy Trinity allows us to name and celebrate the presence of Jesus' Spirit in our lives, among and around us. Any experience of intimacy, no matter how human or religious this may seem, is the gift of the Spirit proclaimed in today's Gospel.

PALESTINIAN FAMILY FLEES TO EGYPT

Following a harsh government ruling that all baby boys should be taken and killed, a young Palestinian man escaped across the border into Egypt with his wife and infant child to take refuge amongst strangers. Thirty years later, as an adult, that child would remember the kindness of those people who took him and his parents in as refugees and enabled them to live in safety. Now a celebrated leader with many followers, he urged them to do the same. "I was a stranger and you invited me in", he said. 'But Master,' they reply. 'When were you a stranger and we invited you in?' 'Ah', he smiled. 'Whenever you do it to others who are in need as I was, you do it to me.' (Matt 35:25)

This coming week is Refugee Week and the theme for this year is "Finding Freedom: Diversity in Community," highlighting the importance of inclusive communities for refugees. In our parish we are recognising Refugee Week with our Hope for Freedom Feast on Saturday night in Harrington Hall. The aim of the Feast is to raise money that will enable a family in desperate need to find safety in our own community in Chatswood.

I recently met a young mother and her daughter who had come to Sydney as refugees and been housed for 16 months in a motel room in Hornsby. When they were at last given a social housing unit in Artarmon, the mother asked us at Vinnies to help them with beds and other furniture for the unfurnished apartment. I had coffee with her last week and she told me her story. She was born in Afghanistan but as a child her parents moved to safety in Iran and when that became unsafe, she took her child to Turkey. At some point, she converted from Islam to Christianity and began evangelising to other Afghani women in Turkey. This put her in considerable danger but fortunately she was granted refugee status by the Australian government. Now that she is settled in Artarmon, her dream is to build a supportive community for the many Afghani people who live in the Chatswood area.

If you come along to the Hope for Freedom Feast on Saturday, you will be able to meet her. Help us to make our city of Chatswood a welcoming refuge just as Egypt was for Jesus and the Holy Family back in 4 AD.

Our Vinnies Conference May Report

OLOS Vinnies received 10 calls for help in May, mercifully still down in number from recent months.

Two were new to us. One had experienced homelessness from a recent DV episode; we helped her to re-establish in some new digs and get help from relevant DV support agencies. The other, suffering depression, was referred to sources of help appropriate to his circumstances. Seven of the other eight calls were for assistance with food arising from ongoing issues and one was for pharmaceuticals help. Some \$500 was expended.

As mentioned last report our financial position is precarious (\$17000 in the red and relying on external help) and we are hopeful that our coming Winter Appeal on 19/20 July will help ease that situation.

JOIN THE FIGHT TO PROTECT LIFE!

"....That night, atrocities were being committed by civilised Germans all over Leipzig, all over the country. Nearly every Jewish home and business in my city was vandalised, burned or otherwise destroyed, as were our synagogues. As were our people . . .; When I think of those Germans relishing our pain, I want to ask them, 'Have you got a soul? Have you got a heart?' It was madness, in the true sense of the word – otherwise civilised people lost all ability to tell right from wrong. They committed terrible atrocities, and worse, they enjoyed it. They thought they were doing the right thing. And even those who could not fool themselves that we Jews were the enemy did nothing to stop the mob. If enough people had stood up then, on Kristallnacht, and said, 'Enough! What are you doing? What is wrong with you?' then the course of history would have been different. But they did not. They were scared. They were weak".





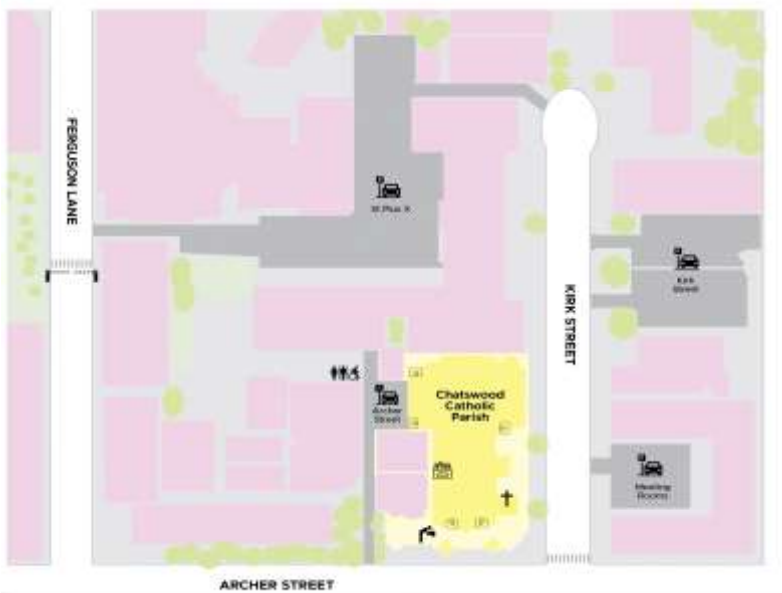
